# Independent auditor's report

## To the shareholder of Right Management Denmark A/S

### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Right Management Denmark A/S for the financial year 01.01.2018 - 31.12.2018, which comprise the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Entity's financial position at 31.12.2018 and of the results of its operations for the financial year 01.01.2018 - 31.12.2018 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

### Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of this auditor's report. We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board of Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### 3. Subordinate loan capital

Debt to Right Management, Inc. is interest free and payable on demand. However, since no payment is planned in 2019, the debt is presented as long-term debt.

### 4. Contingent liabilities

The Company is part of a joint taxation with Manpower Europe Holding ApS as administration company. From the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 2012 the Company has been jointly liable with entities within the tax consolidation for withholding tax, interest, royalties and dividend for the jointly taxed companies. From the 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2013 the joint liability also includes the income taxes.

The Company is part of a joint VAT registration.

### 5. Group relations

### 6. Tax on ordinary results

The company has significant tax losses carried forward. Management has decided not to recognize the deferred tax asset in the balance sheet related to these tax losses. Management estimates that it is uncertain whether the Company within the next 2-3 years will generate a positive taxable income where the deferred tax can be utilized.

## Accounting policies

### Reporting class

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises with addition of certain provisions for reporting class C.

The accounting policies used are unchanged compared to last year. The financial statements are presented in Danish kroner.

### Recognition and measurement

Income is recognised in the profit and loss account when earned. Likewise, all costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to the financial year.

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when the company is liable to achieve future, financial benefits and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the company is liable to lose future, financial benefits and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Later, assets and liabilities are measured as described below for each individual accounting item.

At recognition and measurement, such predictable losses and risks are taken into consideration, which may appear before the financial statement is presented, and which concerns matters existing on the balance sheet day.

### Foreign currency translation

Transactions in foreign currency are translated by using the exchange rate prevailing at the date of the transaction. Differences in the rate of exchange arising between the rate at the date of transaction and the rate at the date of payment are recognised in the profit and loss account as an item under net financials.

### Income statement

#### Gross profit or loss

With reference to the Danish Financial Statements Act section 32, the Company has chosen to aggregate the net turnover, other operating income, and external costs into one line in the income statement, Gross profit.

#### Other external expenses

Other external costs comprise costs for sales, marketing and administration.

#### Other financial expenses

Other financial expenses comprises interest expenses. Other financial income is recognised in the profit and loss account with the amount concerning the financial year.

## Accounting policies

### Balance sheet

#### Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost, usually equalling nominal value less writedowns for bad and doubtful debts.

#### Cash

Cash comprises cash in hand and bank deposits.

#### Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, which usually corresponds to nominal value.
