## **Independent Auditor's Report**

## To the shareholders of Alcatel Submarine Networks Denmark ApS

#### **Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of Alcatel Submarine Networks Denmark ApS for the financial year 1. januar 2017 - 31. december 2017, which comprise an income statement, balance sheet and notes including accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial situation of the Company at 31. december 2017 and of the results of the Company's operations for the financial year 1. januar 2017 - 31. december 2017 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

## **Management's Review**

### The Company's principal activities

The Company's principal activities have been similar to previous years consisting mainly of the operation of the Company's fleet of two cable ships, primarily working with installation and maintenance of existing sea cable systems, as well as related activities for the Group.

## **Development in activities and financial matters**

The Company's Income Statement of the financial year 1. januar 2017 - 31. december 2017 shows a result of DKK 19.799.453 and the Balance Sheet at 31. december 2017 a balance sheet total of DKK 126.002.493 and an equity of DKK 124.969.594.

Besides operation of the two cable ships the Company has in 2016-2017 been involved in a major group project and has received renunciation hereof according to contracts. This project was completed in mid 2017.

### Post financial year events

After the end of the financial year, no events have occurred which may change the financial position of the entity substantially.

## **Accounting Policies**

#### **Reporting Class**

The Annual Report of Alcatel Submarine Networks Denmark ApS for 2017 has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to enterprises of reporting class B.

#### Reporting currency

The Annual Report is presented in Danish kroner.

#### **General Information**

## Basis of recognition and measurement

Income is recognised in the Income Statement as it is earned, including value adjustments of financial assets and liabilities that are measured at fair value or amortised cost. Moreover, all expenses incurred to achieve the earnings for the year are recognised in the Income Statement, including depreciation, amortisation, impairment losses and provisions as well as reversals due to changed accounting estimates of amounts that have previously been recognised in the Income Statement.

Assets are recognised in the Balance Sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits attributable to the asset will accrue to the Company, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the Balance Sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits attributable to the asset will flow out of the Company, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

At initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Subsequently, assets and liabilities are measured as described for each item below.

Certain financial assets and liabilities are measured at amortised cost, which involves the recognition of a constant effective interest rate over the term. Amortised cost is calculated as original cost less repayments and with the addition/deduction of the accumulated amortisation of the difference between the cost and the nominal amount. This way, exchange losses and gains are allocated over the term.

In connection with recognition and measurement, consideration is given to predictable losses and risks occurring prior to the presentation of the Annual Report, i.e. losses and risks which prove or disprove matters which exist at the balance sheet date.

#### **Income Statement**

## Revenue

Income and expenses relating to installation and maintenance work are recognised as work in progress. Income relating to rental of vessels are recognised concurrently with the progress of the rental period.

## Other external expenses

Other external expenses comprise expenses regarding sale and administration.

## **Accounting Policies**

## Amortisation and impairment of tangible and intangible assets

Amortisation and impairment of intangible and tangible assets has been performed based on a continuing assessment of the useful life of the assets in the Company. Non-current assets are amortised on a straight line basis, based on cost, on the basis of the following assessment of useful life and residual values:

#### Vessels:

Hulls and adaptions35 yearsMashinery, tools and equipment10 yearsInspection2-5 yearsTechnical plant and machinery5-10 years

Profit or loss resulting from the sale of intangible or tangible assets is determined as the difference between the selling price less selling costs and the carrying amount at the date of sale, and is recognised in the Income Statement under other operating income or expenses.

#### Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses are recognised in the Income Statement with the amounts that concern the financial year. Financial income and expenses include interest income and expenses, realised and unrealised capital gains and losses regarding securities, debt and foreign currency transactions, dividends received from other equity investments, amortisation of financial assets and liabilities as well as surcharges and allowances under the tax repayment scheme.

#### Tax on net profit/loss for the year

Tax on net profit/loss for the year comprises current tax on expected taxable income of the year and the year's adjustment of deferred tax less the part of the tax of the year that relates to changes in equity. Current and deferred tax regarding changes in equity is recognised directly in equity.

## **Balance Sheet**

## **Tangible assets**

Tangible assets are measured at cost plus revaluations, if any, and less accumulated amortisation and impairment losses. Cost comprises the purchase price and costs directly attributable to the purchase until the date when the asset is available for use.

The residual value is determined at the time of acquisition and are reassessed every year. Where the residual value exceeds the carrying amount of the asset, no further depreciation charges are recognised. In case of changes in the residual value, the effect on the depreciation charges is recognised prospectively as a change in accounting estimates.

#### Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost which usually corresponds to the nominal value. The value is reduced by write-downs for expected bad debts.

#### Accrued income, assets

Accrued income recognised in assets comprises prepaid costs regarding subsequent financial years.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand as well as short-term securities with a term of less than three months which can be converted directly into cash at bank and in hand and involve only an insignificant risk of value changes.

## Liabilities

Other liabilities are measured at amortised cost which usually corresponds to the nominal value.

#### **Current tax liabilities**

Current tax liabilities and current tax receivables are recognised in the Balance Sheet as calculated tax on the expected taxable income for the year, adjusted for tax on taxable income for previous years as well as for tax prepaid.

## **Contingent assets and liabilities**

Contingent assets and liabilities are not recognised in the Balance Sheet but appear only in the notes.
