## Independent auditors' report

To the shareholders of Mousquetaires Holding ApS

Independent auditors' report on the financial statements

We have audited the financial statements of Mousquetaires Holding ApS for the financial year 1 January – 31 December 2015, which comprise income statement, balance sheet and notes, including accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

#### Management's responsibility for the financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of financial statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act. Management is also responsible for such internal control that Management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

#### Auditors' responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and additional requirements under Danish audit regulation. This requires that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditors consider internal control relevant to the preparation of financial statements that give a true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Company's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by Management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Our audit has not resulted in any qualification.

## Management's review

Operating review

Primary activities

The entity's primary activity is to own shares in SMS Passcode A/S.

Development in activities and finances

The income statement for 2015 shows a loss of DKK 5,767 thousand against a profit of DKK 283 thousand last year, and the balance sheet at 31 December 2015 shows equity of DKK -530 thousand.

The development is primarily due to a change in accounting policy for development projects in the subsidiary, which is accounted for using the equity method. Previously, costs of development projects were capitalised as intangible assets and amortised in the P&L. From 2015, costs of development projects are expensed in the P&L.

Events after the balance sheet date

The shares of Mousquetaires Holding ApS were sold to CensorNet Limited, a UK-based IT Security Company, on 18 February 2016.

## Notes to the financial statements

#### 1 Accounting policies

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises with addition of certain provisions for reporting class C.

In accordance with section 110(1) of the Danish Financial Statements Act, consolidated financial statements have not been prepared.

The financial statements have been presented in accordance with the same accounting policies as were applied last year.

#### Recognition and measurement

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

#### Foreign currency translation

On initial recognition, foreign currency transactions are translated applying the exchange rate at the transaction date. Receivables, payables and other monetary items denominated in foreign currencies that have not been settled at the balance sheet date are translated using the exchange rate at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences that arise between the rate at the transaction date and the one in effect at the payment date, or the rate at the balance sheet date are recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.

## Income statement

#### Operating expenses

Operating expenses include expenses relating to the entity's ordinary activities, including insurance, audit fee and other external expenses.

## Income from investments in group enterprises

Income from investments in group enterprises comprises the pro rata share of the individual enterprises' profit/loss after full elimination of internal profits or losses.

#### Financial income

Other financial income comprises interest income, including interest income on receivables from group enterprises, net capital gains on payables and transactions in foreign currencies, etc.

#### Notes to the financial statements

### 1 Accounting policies (continued)

#### Financial expenses

Other financial expenses comprise interest expenses, including interest expenses on payables to group enterprises and net capital losses on payables and transactions in foreign currencies.

#### Income taxes

Tax for the year, which consists of current tax for the year and changes in deferred tax, is recognised in the income statement by the portion attributable to the profit for the year and recognised directly in equity by the portion attributable to entries directly in equity.

The entity is jointly taxed with its Danish subsidiary. The current Danish income tax is allocated among the jointly taxed entities in proportion to their taxable income (full allocation with a refund concerning tax losses).

#### Balance sheet

#### Investments in group enterprises

Investments in group enterprises are recognised and measured according to the equity method. This means that investments are measured at the pro rata share of the enterprises' equity.

Group enterprises with negative equity are measured at DKK 0, and any receivables from these enterprises are written down by the Parent's share of such negative equity value if it is deemed irrecoverable. If the negative equity value exceeds the amount receivable, the remaining amount is recognised under provisions if the Parent has a legal or constructive obligation to cover the liabilities of the relevant enterprise.

Upon distribution of profit or loss, net revaluation of investments in group enterprises is transferred to reserve for net revaluation according to the equity method under equity.

Investments in group enterprises are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

#### Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost, usually corresponding to nominal value less write-downs for bad and doubtful debts.

#### Tax payable or receivable

Current tax payable or receivable is recognised in the balance sheet, stated as tax calculated on this year's taxable income, adjusted for prepaid tax.

#### Cash

Cash comprises cash in hand and bank deposits.

#### Dividend

Dividend is recognised as a liability at the time of adoption at the general meeting. The proposed dividend for the financial year is disclosed as a separate item in equity.

#### Liabilities

Financial liabilities are measured at net realisable value.

## Notes to the financial statements

### 2 Going concern assumption

The Company's current liabilities exceed the current assets by DKK 530 thousand. The Company's current liabilities include amounts owed to its wholly owned subsidiary SMS Passcode A/S of DKK 1,410 thousand. The subsidiary has confirmed that it will only require the amount to be repaid within the financial capabilities of the Company. On this basis, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

## 8 Contractual obligations and contingencies, etc.

#### Contingent liabilities

The Company participates in a Danish joint taxation arrangement in which it serves as the administration company. According to the joint taxation provisions of the Danish Corporation Tax Act, the Company is therefore liable from the financial year 2013 for income taxes etc. for the jointly taxed companies and from 1July 2012 also for obligations, if any, relating to the withholding of tax on interest, royalties and dividend for the jointly taxed companies.

#### 9 Ownership

CensorNet Limited owns 100 % of the shares in the company.
