## Independent auditor's report

### To the shareholder of Tasklet Factory ApS

#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Tasklet Factory ApS for the financial year 1 July 2019 – 30 June 2020 comprising income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Company's assets, liabilities and financial position at 30 June 2020 and of the results of the Company's operations for the financial year 1 July 2019 – 30 June 2020 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

#### Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the "Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements" section of our report.

## Management's review

### Operating review

#### Principal activities

The primary activity of Tasklet Factory ApS is selling and delivering the Mobile WMS solution through a global network of resellers. The reseller network includes +200 resellers in 35 countries, and the customer list includes +700 customers. Tasklet Factory has expanded its business and is now a reseller of autonomous transportation robots from Mobile Industrial Robots (MIR). A new business unit has been established to target this market.

#### Development in activities and financial position

The Company reported an operating profit of DKK 6,412 thousand and a profit after tax of DKK 4,598 thousand. Equity represented DKK 6,561 thousand at 30 of June 2020.

Profit for the year is considered satisfactory.

COVID-19 affected the last two months of the year, but not to any critical extent. Management keeps close track of the development.

The subsidiary, Tasklet Factory Inc., performs in line with expectations and is now profitable. As planned, an employee from the Danish organisation and his family have successfully moved to Tampa to run the company.

As expected, the robotics business unit is not yet profitable.

Our products are still in high demand and do not pose any major technical challenges.

#### Events after the balance sheet date

No events have occurred after the financial year end of importance to the Company's financial position.

#### Outlook

The Company has continuously performed well after the financial year end, and COVID-19 does currently not have any significant impact on the business. Global presence and customers within different industries minimise the impact of COVID-19.

### Notes

#### 1 Accounting policies

The annual report of Tasklet Factory ApS for 2019/20 has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applying to reporting class B entities under the Danish Financial Statements Act with opt-in from higher reporting classes.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those of last year.

#### Omission of consolidated financial statements

Pursuant to section 110(1) of the Danish Financial Statements Act, no consolidated financial statements have been prepared.

### Income statement

#### Gross profit

Pursuant to section 32 of the Danish Financial Statements Act, the Company has decided only to disclose gross profit.

#### Revenue

Upon the sale of licenses for standard software, license fees are recognised immediately after software delivery has taken place and subject to customer acceptance of functionality.

When sold through partnerships, the Company's share of licenses is recognised when delivery to end-user has been made. Revenue from maintenance agreements is recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the agreement.

Net sales are measured at the fair value of the agreed consideration excl. VAT and taxes charged on behalf of third parties. All forms of discounts are recognised in net sales.

#### Cost of sales

Cost of sales comprises costs incurred to generate revenue for the year, including direct and indirect costs of raw materials and consumables.

#### Other external costs

Other external costs include cost of sales, advertising, administration, buildings, bad debts, operating lease costs, etc.

#### Staff costs

Staff costs comprise wages and salaries, including holiday pay and pensions and other costs for social security, etc. for the Company's employees. Refunds from public authorities are deducted from staff costs.

#### 1 Accounting policies (continued)

##### Income from equity investments in group entities

The proportionate share of the individual subsidiaries' profit/loss after tax is recognised in the Parent Company's income statement after full elimination of intra-group gains/losses and amortisation of goodwill.

##### Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses include interest income and expenses, realised and unrealised gains and losses arising from investments in financial assets, debt and transactions in foreign currencies, amortisation of financial assets and liabilities, etc. Financial income and expenses are recognised in the income statement by the amounts that relate to the financial year.

##### Tax on profit for the year

Tax for the year, which consists of the current tax for the year and changes in deferred tax, is recognised in the income statement by the portion attributable to the profit for the year, and is recognised directly in the equity by the portion attributable to entries directly in equity.

### Balance sheet

##### Equity investments in group entities

Equity investments in group entities are measured at the proportionate share of the entities' net asset value calculated in accordance with the Group's accounting policies plus or minus unrealised intra-group gains or losses and plus or minus the residual value of positive and negative goodwill calculated in accordance with the acquisition method.

Equity investments in group entities with negative net asset values are measured at DKK 0, and any receivables from these entities are written down by an amount equivalent to the negative net asset value. To the extent that the negative net asset value exceeds the receivable, the residual amount is recognised as provisions.

Net revaluation of equity investments in group entities is tied as a net revaluation reserve under equity according to the equity method to the extent that the carrying amount exceeds cost. Dividends from group entities expected to be adopted in the group entities prior to the approval of the Company's annual report, are not tied up in the revaluation reserve.

##### Property, plant and equipment

Fixtures and fittings, tools and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

The depreciation base is cost less estimated residual value after end of useful life.

The cost includes the acquisition price and costs incurred directly in connection with the acquisition until the time when the asset is ready to be used.

#### 1 Accounting policies (continued)

Straight-line depreciation is provided on the basis of an assessment of the expected useful lives of the assets and their residual value:

Fixtures and fittings	3 years
Equipment	2 years

The useful life and residual value are reassessed annually. Changes are treated as accounting estimates, and the effect on depreciation is recognised prospectively.

Profit or loss on the disposal of property, plant and equipment is stated as the difference between the sales price less selling costs and the carrying amount at the time of sale. Profit or loss is recognised in the income statement as other operating income or other operating expenses.

#### Impairment of fixed assets

The carrying amount of intangible assets and property, plant and equipment as well as equity investments in group entities and associates is subject to an annual test for indications of impairment other than the decrease in value reflected by depreciation or amortisation.

Impairment tests are conducted of individual assets or groups of assets when there is an indication that they may be impaired. Write-down is made to the recoverable amount if this is lower than the carrying amount.

The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's net selling price and its value in use. The value in use is determined as the present value of the forecast net cash flows from the use of the asset or the group of assets, including forecast net cash flows from the disposal of the asset or the group of assets after the end of the useful life.

#### Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost.

Write-down is made for bad debt losses where there is an objective indication that a receivable or a portfolio of receivables has been impaired. If there is an objective indication that an individual receivable has been impaired, write-down is made on an individual basis.

#### Prepayments

Prepayments comprise prepayment of costs incurred relating to subsequent financial years.

#### Securities and equity investments

Securities and investments, recognised as current assets, comprise public quoted bonds, shares and other current investments that are measured at fair market value on the balance sheet date. Public quoted securities are measured at quoted price. Non-quoted securities are measured at sales value based on computed net present value.

##### Equity

###### *Dividends*

The expected dividends payment for the year is disclosed as a separate item under equity.

##### Corporation tax and deferred tax

Current tax payable and receivable is recognised in the balance sheet as tax computed on the taxable income for the year, adjusted for tax on the taxable income of prior years and for tax paid on account.

Deferred tax is measured using the balance sheet liability method on all temporary differences between the carrying amount and the tax value of assets and liabilities based on the planned use of the asset or settlement of the liability. However, deferred tax is not recognised on temporary differences relating to goodwill non-deductible for tax purposes and on office premises and other items where the temporary differences arise at the date of acquisition without affecting either profit/loss or taxable income.

Deferred tax assets, including the tax value of tax loss carryforwards, are recognised at the expected value of their utilisation within the foreseeable future; either as a set-off against tax on future income or as a set-off against deferred tax liabilities in the same legal tax entity. Any deferred net assets are measured at net realisable value.

Deferred tax is measured in accordance with the tax rules and at the tax rates applicable at the balance sheet date when the deferred tax is expected to crystallise as current tax. Changes in deferred tax as a result of changes in tax rates are recognised in the income statement or equity, respectively.

##### Liabilities other than provisions

Financial liabilities are recognised at cost at the date of borrowing, corresponding to the proceeds received less transaction costs paid. In subsequent periods, the financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Accordingly, the difference between cost and the nominal value is recognised in the income statement over the term of the loan together with interest expenses.

##### Deferred income

Deferred income comprises advance invoicing regarding income in subsequent years.

#### 6 Contractual obligations, contingencies, etc.

##### Contingent liabilities

The Company has entered into a lease agreement that cannot be terminated before expiry on 14 September 2021. Annual lease payments amount to DKK 644 thousand for the period 15 April 2020 - 14 April 2021.

The Company is jointly taxed with other Danish companies in the Group. As a jointly taxed company, the Company has unlimited liability for Danish corporation taxes and withholding taxes on dividends, interest and royalties within the joint taxation unit. Any subsequent corrections of joint taxation income or withholding taxes could result in an increased liability for the Company.

##### Operating lease obligations

The Company has entered into operating leases with a remaining term of 21 months and an average monthly lease payment of DKK 10 thousand, totalling DKK 213 thousand.

##### Charges and collateral

For balances with credit institutions, a floating charge of DKK 500 thousand has been issued secured upon assets with a carrying amount of DKK 3,816 thousand.
