To the shareholder of REnescience A/S

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of REnescience A/S for the financial year 1 January - 31 December 2016, which comprise an income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes. The financial statements are prepared under the Danish Financial Statements Act.
