To the Shareholder of Maersk Trade Finance A/S

Opinion

In our opinion, the Financial Statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Company at 31 December 2022, and of the results of the Company's operations for the financial year 1 January 2022 - 31 December 2022 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

We have audited the Financial Statements of Maersk Trade Finance A/S for the financial year 1 January 2022 - 31 December 2022, which comprise a summary of significant accounting policies, income statement, balance sheet and notes ("financial statements").

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Maersk Trade Finance A/S Management's review

Principal activities of the Company

The Company's operating activities is to provide financing, managing transports, trade and service in Denmark and abroad as well as other related activities.

Development in activities and financial matters

The income statement of the Company for 2022 shows a profit after tax of USD 2,051 thousand.

Maersk has taken a strategic decision to not offer the trade finance product to any new customers and the Company's activities has consequently decreased significantly in 2022. The future long term activities of the Company remain to be determined.

Maersk Trade Finance Services A/S, a subsidiary of Maersk Trade Finance A/S has been merged with Maersk Trade Finance A/S with accounting effect as of 1st January 2022. All the assets and liabilities as well as other rights and obligations are deemed to have been transferred to Maersk Trade Finance A/S as on merger date. Gain on merger of subsidiary has been recorded as part of income statement in year 2022 for USD 1,009 thousand.

Events after the balance sheet date

On 27 January 2023, A.P. Møller - Mærsk announced intention to move towards a singular and unified Maersk brand. The decision is not expected to have impact on the Company's financial result, nor assets or equity. No significant event have occurred after the balance sheet date up to date of this report which would influence the evaluation of this annual report.

Maersk Trade Finance A/S Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Annual Report of Maersk Trade Finance A/S has been prepared in accordance with the provisions under the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to enterprises of Reporting Class - B.

Since the A.P. Møller - Mærsk A/S group significant classes of transactions are performed in USD, therefore management has decided to prepare the annual report in USD. Functional currency of this company is USD. At 31 December 2022 the exchange rate was USD/DKK 6.97 (31 December 2021: 6.55).

The accounting policies used in the preparation to the financial statements are consistent with those of last year.

There was an error in tax presentation while arriving at the results for the year 2021. The same has now been corrected and restated in comparatives for the year 2021. The correction impacted tax presentation as well as equity for the year 2021. Joint tax asset increased from USD 458 thousand to USD 2,071 thousand and tax in income statement being reduced from USD 2,126 thousand to USD 513 thousand. Equity for the year 2021 being increased from to USD 38,892 thousand to USD 40,505 thousand.

Recognition and measurement in general

Assets are recognised in the balance when it is probable that future financial benefits will arise at recognition. Subsequently, assets and liabilities are measured as described below for each item. Revenue is recognised in the income statement when earned. Furthermore, costs that are necessary for obtaining the revenue are recognised.

Foreign currency translation

Transactions in other currency than the functional currency are translated at the exchange rate on the date of the transaction. Monetary items in foreign currency that are not settled on the balance sheet date are translated at exchange rate on the balance sheet date. Foreign exchange rate gains and loss are included in the income statement as financial items.

Income statement

Revenue

Revenue includes interest income, line opening fees and processing fees earned from trade finance services offered to the Maersk customers.

Merger

Merger is accounted for by using business combination method. All the assets and liabilities as well as other rights and obligations are deemed to have been transferred at balance sheet value as on merger date. Gain on merger of subsidiary has been recorded as other income in income statement for the year 2022.

External costs

External costs includes consultant fees, administration and overhead costs etc. External cost also includes write-off in debtors.

Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses, includes interest, exchange gains and losses concerning items in foreign currencies and dividends received from Group enterprises.

Tax and deferred tax

The Company is jointly taxed with Danish Companies in the A.P. Møller - Mærsk A/S Group and A.P. Møller Holding A/S. The current Danish company tax is distributed by allocating joint taxation contributions among the jointly taxed enterprises in proportion to the taxable income of these enterprises.

The tax for the year, which includes the current company tax for the year (the joint taxation contribution), and the change in deferred tax are recognised in the income statement with the share that can be attributed to the results for the year and directly in the equity with the share that can be attributed to the entries directly in the equity.

Deferred tax are recognised by all temporary differences between the accounting and taxable values of assets and liabilities. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent expected to be realised.

Maersk Trade Finance A/S Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Balance sheet

Investments in subsidiaries

Investments in subsidiaries are recognised at cost price. Where cost price exceeds the recoverable amount, write-down is made to lower value.

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost.

Write-down is made for bad debt losses when there is objective evidence that a receivable has been impaired. If there is objective evidence that an individual receivable has been impaired, write-down is made on an individual basis.

Cash and equivalents

For the purpose of presentation in the statement, cash and cash equivalents include deposits on demand which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Equity

Proposed dividends are recognised as a liability at the time of adoption at the General Meeting. The expected dividends payment for the year is shown as a separate item under Equity.

Payables

Payables are measured at amortised cost, equal to nominal value.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation from past events. The item includes, among other things, legal disputes, provisions for loans which were not recovered as after due date as per credit policy of Maersk Trade Finance A/S.
