Management's review

Business review

The company's activities are to develop projects within renewable energy, including advising on this. Contracts have been entered into where invoicing can only take place once the necessary permits have been obtained. In addition, investments are made in project companies that have the rights to utilize renewable energy.

Financial review

The company's income statement for the year ended 30 September 2022 shows a profit of DKK 113.224, and the balance sheet at 30 September 2022 shows equity of DKK 209.922.

Through subsidiaries, the company has initiated the design of wind turbines in Sicily and Calabria. Once the project is completed, the subsidiaries will be sold. Due to the outbreak of COVID-19, which has hit Italy particularly hard, there has only been a modest development of the projects and after COVID-19 it still goes slow.

The company owns 1 project company, where conditional agreements have been entered into the sale of shares in previous years.

The company has sold a company on a conditional sale agreement, which has resulted in a smaller income a few years ago. Furthermore the company has last year received a prepayment of around DKK 1 million. The company accrues a significant income when the buyer initiates the project. It is expected that the final transfer can take place before the end of 2023.

The majority of the company's creditors are to the company's owners as well as prepayments received. Management expects to be able to complete the projects so that the prepayments do not have to be repaid.

Significant events occurring after the end of the financial year

No events have occurred after the balance sheet date which could significantly affect the company's financial position.

Accounting policies

The annual report of Baltic Energy Group ApS for 2021/22 has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to enterprises of reporting class B, as well as provisions applying to reporting class C entities.

The accounting policies applied are consistent with those of last year.

The annual report for 2021/22 is presented in DKK

Pursuant to sections §110 subsection 1, of the Danish Financial Statements Act, the company has not prepared consolidated financial statements.

Basis of recognition and measurement

Income is recognised in the income statement as earned, including value adjustments of financial assets and liabilities. All expenses, including amortisation, depreciation and impairment losses, are also recognised in the income statement.

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the company and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits will flow from the company and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. On subsequent recognition, assets and liabilities are measured as described below for each individual accounting item.

Certain financial assets and liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Amortised cost is calculated as the historic cost less any installments and plus/less the accumulated amortisation of the difference between the cost and the nominal amount.

On recognition and measurement, allowance is made for predictable losses and risks which occur before the annual report is presented and which confirm or invalidate matters existing at the balance sheet date.

Income statement

Gross profit

Gross profit reflects an aggregation of revenue less other external expenses.

Revenue

Income is recognized in the income statement if the transfer of risk, usually upon delivery to the buyer, has taken place and if the income can be calculated reliably and is expected to be received.

Other external costs

Other external costs include expenses related to administration etc.

Accounting policies

Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses are recognized in the income statement with the amounts relating to the financial year. Financial items include interest income and expenses, debt and transactions in foreign currency, amortization of financial assets and liabilities as well as surcharges and reimbursement under the advance tax scheme, etc.

Tax on profit/loss for the year

Tax for the year, which comprises the current tax charge for the year and changes in the deferred tax charge, is recognised in the income statement as regards the portion that relates to the profit/loss for the year and directly in equity as regards the portion that relates to entries directly in equity.

Balance sheet

Investments in subsidiaries and capital interest

Investment in subsidiaries and capital interest are measured at cost. If cost exceeds the recoverable amount, a write-down is made to this lower value.

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost and reduced with impairment loss if nessecary.

An impairment loss is recognised if there is objective evidence that a receivable or a group of receivables is impaired. If there is objective evidence that an individual receivable is impaired, an impairment loss for that individual asset is recognised.

Equity

Dividends

Proposed dividends are disclosed as a separate item under equity. Dividends are recognised as a liability when declared by the annual general meeting of shareholders.

Income tax and deferred tax

Deferred tax assets, including the tax base of tax losses allowed for carry forward, are measured at the value to which the asset is expected to be realised, either as a set-off against tax on future income or as a set-off against deferred tax liabilities within the same legal tax entity. Any deferred net tax assets are measured at net realisable value.

Liabilities

Liabilities, which include trade payables, payables to group entities and other payables, are measured at amortised cost, which is usually equivalent to nominal value.

Deferred income

Prepayments and accrued income comprise payments received relating to income in subsequent years.

Accounting policies

Foreign currency translation

On initial recognition, foreign currency transactions are translated applying the exchange rate at the transaction date. Foreign exchange differences arising between the exchange rates at the transaction date and at the date of payment are recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses. If foreign currency instruments are considered cash flow hedges, any unrealised value adjustments are taken directly to a fair value reserve under 'Equity'.

Receivables and payables and other monetary items denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rates at the balance sheet date. The difference between the exchange rates at the balance sheet date and the date at which the receivable or payable arose or was recognised in the latest financial statements is recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.
