Independent auditor's report

To the shareholders of Sunstone LSV GP BI Holding ApS Opinion

Accounting policies

Reporting class

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements for reporting class B with addition of certain provisions from reporting class C.

The accounting policies applied for these financial statements are consistent with those applied last year.

The annual report is presented in DKK 1,000.

Recognition and measurement

Assets are recognized in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognized in the balance sheet when the Entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognized in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognized by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

Other external expenses

Other external expenses include expenses relating to administration.

Income from investments in group enterprises

Income from investments in group enterprises comprises the pro rata share of the individual enterprises' profit/loss after full elimination of internal unrealised profits or losses.

Other financial expenses

Other financial expenses comprise interest expenses, including interest expenses on payables to group enterprises, foregin exchange losses and tax surcharge under the Danish Tax Prepayment Scheme etc.

Accounting policies

Balance sheet

Investments in group enterprises

Investments in group enterprises are recognised and measured according to the equity method. This means that investments are measured at the pro rata share of the enterprises' equities.

The Company's share of the enterprises' profits and losses after elimination of unrealised intra-group profits and losses is recognised in the income statement.

The carrying value in excess of cost is taken to reserve for net revaluation under the equity method.

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost, usually equalling nominal value less write-downs for bad and doubtful debts.

Cash

Cash comprises bank deposits.

Dividend

Dividend is recognized as a liability at the time of adoption at the general meeting. The proposed dividend for the financial year is disclosed as a separate item in equity.

Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortized cost and comprises other prepaid contributions from limited partners.
