## Independent auditor's report

#### To the shareholders of Brainreader A/S

#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Brainreader A/S for the financial year 01.01.2022 -31.12.2022, which comprise the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Entity's financial position at 31.12.2022 and of the results of its operations for the financial year 01.01.2022 - 31.12.2022 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

#### **Basis for opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the "Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements" section of this auditor's report. We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional ethical requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### Management commentary

#### **Primary activities**

The Company's primary activities consist of developing and commercialising medical image processing software which is able to analyse MR scans of the brain and assess degeneration of brain structures. The customers are radiology departments at public and private hospitals as well as private scanning clinics.

#### **Development in activities and finances**

The Company's course of development is positive despite the fact that equity at the balance sheet date is negative by DKK 6,364k and the Company is subject to the rules governing loss of capital as laid down in the Danish Companies Act. Management remains engaged in efforts to raise capital. During 2022 more than DKK 15m has been contributed by way of equity increases and convertible loans, and after the balance sheet date approx. DKK 3m has been invested as part of the plan. See note 1 for further detail.

In 2022, the Company expanded its activities in the US, e.g. by strengthening the local organization in the US. Sales cycles remain long, however the Company has been able to retain existing customers and add new during 2022. A first important VAR partnership was completed with Infinitt Healthcare in North America in June 2022, and the strategy to expand partly via partners continues to be pursued. In 2022, the Company also launched several new Neuroreader features in response to customer requests. Most important is an asymmetry report showing 12 structures added for brain index asymmetry and 20 new brain volume indexes. The Brainreader Mediationserver was upgraded to allow for improved user management and seamless integration through PACS allowing users to access Neuroreader seamless through their worklist.

During 2022, additional drugs for treatment of Alzheimer's Disease were approved by FDA, and an increasing number of other drugs are in the pipeline for approval. This opens new very interesting treatment options for patients and healthcare professionals worldwide and is expected to be of significance to Neuroreader by way of the application as part of triage, and already being a superior quality and recognized aid for diagnosis.

The Company has generated a loss of DKK 17,374k. Equity amounts to negative DKK 6,364k on 31 December 2022.

The original platform, which was developed in previous years, is still capitalized, see note 5 for further information.

#### Events after the balance sheet date

After the balance sheet date, the Company has secured approx. DKK 3m by way of loans and commitments for further capital with reference to note 1.

No more events have occurred after the balance sheet date to this date, which would influence the evaluation of this annual report.

#### **6 Development projects**

Completed development projects and projects in progress comprise the development of the Company's software to be used for analysis of MRI data from radiology departments at public and private hospitals.

As of 31.12.2022, the cost of the basic platform still remains with addition of the new version developed in 2022 which comprises three key areas:

- 1. Re-design and new software development of our Mediationserver with major improvements
- 2. Neuroreader backend software development to integrate with new Mediationserver
- 3. Software development of Brainreader specific operational systems

All above activities has as per our QMS system and regulatory requirements required clinical and statistical validations prior to release.

Completed development projects are amortised over a period of 5 years.

Management has not identified any further indication of impairment on the carrying amount.

#### 9 Tax receivable

The outstanding corporate tax receivable included in the balance sheet relates to the use of the tax credit scheme under section 8X of the Danish Tax AssessmentAct, whereby the company receives payment for the tax value of losses resulting from research and development expenses. Based on the review of the criteria forusing the scheme, it is management's clear understanding that the company is eligible to use the scheme, and the recognition has been made based on thisassessment. There is a risk that the Danish Tax Authority may determine that the conditions for using the scheme have not been met. If so, subsequent financialyears will be negatively affected by the reduction of the outstanding corporate tax receivable through "Tax for the year" in the consolidated statement of profit orloss and other comprehensive income.

Debt to Vækstfonden is secured by way of an indemnity letter, with security in immaterial assets, inventory and operation equipment. with a total value of 5,689 k.DKK.

## **Accounting policies**

#### **Reporting class**

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises with addition of a few provisions for reporting class C.

#### **Changes in accounting policies**

In accordance with the offsetting prohibition in the Danish Financial Statements Act. §13, litra. 1, No. 8 is staff costs, which is associated with work carried out for oneself bill and activated, previously offset in staff costs. These are now presented separately in the income statement as "work done for own account and listed under assets" under Gross Profit/Loss.

The changes result in an increase of the personnel costs in 2022 of 862 k.DKK and in 2021 at 428 k.DKK. Changes has also had an decrease effect on the gross profit/loss. It changed presentation has not had an impact on the year result, balance sheet or equity.

Comparison figures are adapted to the changed accounting practices.

Apart from the above areas, the annual report is submitted according to the same accounting practices like last year.

#### **Consolidated financial statements**

Referring to section 110 of the Danish Financial Statements Act, no consolidated financial statements have been prepared.

#### **Recognition and measurement**

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the Entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

#### **Foreign currency translation**

On initial recognition, foreign currency transactions are translated applying the exchange rate at the transaction date. Receivables, payables and other monetary items denominated in foreign currencies that have not been

settled at the balance sheet date are translated using the exchange rate at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences that arise between the rate at the transaction date and the one in effect at the payment date, or the rate at the balance sheet date are recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.

#### **Income statement**

#### Gross profit or loss

Gross profit or loss comprises revenue and external expenses.

#### Revenue

Revenue from the sale of services is recognised in the income statement when delivery is made to the buyer. Revenue is recognised net of VAT, duties and sales discounts and is measured at fair value of the consideration fixed.

#### **Own work capitalised**

Own work capitalised comprises staff costs incurred in the financial year and recognised in cost for proprietary intangible assets.

#### Other external expenses

Other external expenses include expenses relating to the Entity's ordinary activities, including expenses for premises, stationery and office supplies, marketing costs, etc. This item also includes writedowns of receivables recognised in current assets.

#### **Staff costs**

Staff costs comprise salaries and wages as well as social security contributions, pension contributions, etc for entity staff.

#### Depreciation, amortisation and impairment losses

Amortisation, depreciation and impairment losses relating to intangible assets and property, plant and equipment comprise amortisation, depreciation and impairment losses for the financial year, calculated on the basis of the residual values and useful lives of the individual assets and impairment testing as well as gains and losses from the sale of intangible assets as well as property, plant and equipment.

#### Other financial expenses

Other financial expenses comprise interest expenses, including interest expenses on payables to group enterprises, net capital losses on securities, payables and foreign currency transactions, amortisation of financial liabilities as well as tax surcharge under the Danish Tax Prepayment Scheme etc.

#### Tax on profit/loss for the year

Tax for the year, which consists of current tax for the year and changes in deferred tax, is recognised in the income statement by the portion attributable to the profit for the year and recognised directly in equity by the portion attributable to entries directly in equity.

#### **Balance sheet**

#### Intellectual property rights etc.

Intellectual property rights etc comprise development projects completed and in progress.

Development projects on clearly defined and identifiable products and processes, for which the technical rate of utilisation, adequate resources and a potential future market or development opportunity in the enterprise can be established, and where the intention is to manufacture, market or apply the

product or process in question, are recognised as intangible assets. Other development costs are recognised as costs in the income statement as incurred.

The cost of development projects comprises costs such as salaries and amortisation that are directly and indirectly attributable to the development projects.

Indirect production costs in the form of indirectly attributable staff costs and amortisation of intangible assets and depreciation on property, plant and equipment used in the development process are recognised in cost based on time spent on each project.

Completed development projects are amortised on a straight-line basis using the estimated useful lives of the assets. The amortisation period is 5 years. For development projects protected by intellectual property rights, the maximum amortisation period is the remaining duration of the relevant rights. Development projects are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

Intellectual property rights acquired are measured at cost less accumulated amortisation.

Intellectual property rights etc are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

#### Property, plant and equipment

Other fixtures and fittings, tools and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Cost comprises the acquisition price, costs directly attributable to the acquisition and preparation costs of the asset until the time when it is ready to be put into operation.

The basis of depreciation is cost less estimated residual value after the end of useful life. Straight-line depreciation is made on the basis of the following estimated useful lives of the assets:

Estimated useful lives and residual values are reassessed annually.

Items of property, plant and equipment are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

#### Investments in group enterprises

Investments in group enterprises are measured at cost. Investments are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

#### Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost, usually equalling nominal value less writedowns for bad and doubtful debts.

#### Tax payable or receivable

Current tax payable or receivable is recognised in the balance sheet, stated as tax computed on this year's taxable income, adjusted for prepaid tax.

#### Prepayments

Prepayments comprise incurred costs relating to subsequent financial years. Prepayments are measured at cost.

#### Cash

Cash comprises bank deposits.

#### Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, which usually corresponds to nominal value.

#### **Deferred income**

Deferred income comprises income received for recognition in subsequent financial years. Deferred income is measured at cost.
