Independent auditor's extended review report

To the shareholders of Many Digital A/S

Conclusion

We have performed an extended review of the financial statements of Many Digital A/S for the financial year 01.01.2022 - 31.12.2022, which comprise the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Based on our extended review, in our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Entity's financial position at 31.12.2022 and of the results of its operations for the financial year 01.01.2022 - 31.12.2022 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Basis for conclusion

We conducted our extended review in accordance with the assurance engagement standard for small enterprises as issued by the Danish Business Authority and the standard on extended review of financial statements prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act as issued by FSR - Danish Auditors. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the "Auditor's responsibilities for the extended review of the financial statements" section. We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional ethical requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. We believe that the evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our conclusion.

The procedures performed in an extended review are less in scope than in an audit, and accordingly we do not express an audit opinion on the financial statements.

Our conclusion on the financial statements does not cover the management commentary, and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our extended review of the financial statements our responsibility is to read the management commentary and, in doing so, consider whether the management commentary is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the extended review or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

Moreover, it is our responsibility to consider whether the management commentary provides the information required under the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Based on the work we have performed, we conclude that the management commentary is in accordance with financial statements and has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Danish Financial Statements Act. We did not identify any material misstatement of the management commentary.

Management commentary

Primary activities

The company's purpose is to develop, sell and maintain a digital, IT-based platform for rightholders primarily within the sports industry. Furthermore, the company operates as consulting within digital strategy, communication and Social Media and fields related to these areas.

Description of material changes in activities and finances

The financial year shows a loss of DKK 3,847,305 against last year's loss of DKK 3,664,309.

2022 has been a challenging year for Many Digital A/S as, in the spring of 2022, we realised that our platform, developed over several years, showed some instability when handling a large number of simultaneous users, which resulted in a major and thorough external review of the platform, and a roadmap was created to address this challenge. The platform is now fully developed and only needs to be further developed, as new and future customers sign up.

This work has now been completed in early 2023, tested and approved and is thus in place, which means that the platform and thus Many Digital A/S can continue taking on new customers and scaling the business, cf. the budget.

As a result, the financial year has seen incurrence of higher and extraordinary costs, while not achieving the expected revenue.

As far as 2023 is concerned, our development costs will be reduced, cf. above, and the dialogue with the already strong pipeline will be intensified, expecting that several of these can be converted to customers, cf. the budget.

An amount of DKK 1 million will be contributed to Many Digital A/S in connection with an extraordinary general meeting, where the cap table and the company's board of directors will be adjusted, as this will ensure Many Digital A/S the needed runway.

Events after the balance sheet date

No events have occurred after the balance sheet date to this date, which would influence the evaluation of this annual report.

1 Going concern

A capital increase of DKK 1 million will be contributed to Many Digital A/S in connection with an extraordinary general in May this year, Management and the board of directors have already prepared and developed investorpitch material for a capital increase expected in Q4 2023. There are ongoing positive dialogues with already identified long term investors. Moreover, as described in the management commentary, Management expects a reduction in costs as a result of the fully developed IT platform and also expects revenue to increase.

9 Development projects

Capitalised completed development projects relate to the Company's incurred costs for further development of an IT platform with associated mobile applications (iOS and Android apps) targeted at sports rightholders, their fans and commercial partners.

Through the development project, the Company has further tested, made major changes and sold the IT platform and the associated apps to customers in Denmark and the UK in 2022 and on this basis has capitalised the development project.

The capitalised development costs also relate to the expansion of the IT platform's technical functionality and stability, including in particular integrations with several third-party IT services, which strengthen both the Company's and the customers' business gain from the IT platform.

Having resolved the performance challenges on the IT platform in spring 2022, the platform is now fully developed.

The pipeline of potential new customers is significantly better now as the need in the market for this type of platform is much higher now. Management also expects future earnings on the IT platform that significantly

exceed the value of the capitalised development costs.

Focus is on converting leads now to customers and preparing MANY for future growth in a market getting better and better every day.

The IT platform is amortised over 5 years.

14 Contingent liabilities

A contingent liability relating to an earn-out agreement concerning the acquisition of intellectual property rights is incumbent on the Company. The maximum payment agreed amounts to DKK 550,000 based on revenue from the intangible asset up until the end of 2026.

15 Assets charged and collateral

Debt to Vaekstfonden is secured on a floating charge of DKK 3,200,000. The floating charge comprises intangible assets and unsecured claims from trade receivables. The carrying amount of the assets charged is DKK 6.7 million.

Accounting policies

Reporting class

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises with addition of a few provisions for reporting class C.

The accounting policies applied to these financial statements are consistent with those applied last year, with some reclassifications.

Recognition and measurement

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the Entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

Income statement

Gross profit or loss

Gross profit or loss comprises revenue, own work capitalised, other operating income and external expenses.

Revenue

Revenue from the sale of services is recognised in the income statement when delivery is made to the buyer. Revenue is recognised net of VAT, duties and sales discounts and is measured at fair value of the consideration fixed.

Other operating income

Other operating income comprises income of a secondary nature as viewed in relation to the Entity's primary activities.

Other external expenses

Other external expenses include expenses relating to the Entity's ordinary activities, including expenses for premises, stationery and office supplies, marketing costs, etc. This item also includes writedowns of receivables recognised in current assets.

Staff costs

Staff costs comprise salaries and wages, and social security contributions, pension contributions, etc for entity staff.

Depreciation, amortisation and impairment losses

Depreciation, amortisation and impairment losses relating to property, plant and equipment and intangible assets comprise depreciation, amortisation and impairment losses for the financial year, and gains and losses from the sale of intangible assets and property, plant and equipment.

Other financial income

Other financial income comprises exchange gains on payables and transactions in foreign currencies.

Other financial expenses

Other financial expenses comprise interest expenses.

Tax on profit/loss for the year

Tax for the year, which consists of current tax for the year and changes in deferred tax, is recognised in the income statement by the portion attributable to the profit for the year and recognised directly in equity by the portion attributable to entries directly in equity.

The Entity is jointly taxed with all Danish group enterprises. The current Danish income tax is allocated among the jointly taxed entities proportionally to their taxable income (full allocation with a refund concerning tax losses).

Balance sheet

Intellectual property rights etc.

Intellectual property rights etc comprise development projects completed and in progress with related intellectual property rights, acquired intellectual property rights and prepayments for intangible assets.

Development projects on clearly defined and identifiable products and processes, for which the technical rate of utilisation, adequate resources and a potential future market or development opportunity in the enterprise can be established, and where the intention is to manufacture, market or apply the product or process in question, are recognised as intangible assets. Other development costs are recognised as costs in the income statement as incurred. When recognising development projects as intangible assets, an amount equalling the costs incurred less deferred tax is taken to equity under Reserve for development costs that is reduced as the development projects are amortised and written down.

The cost of development projects comprises costs such as salaries and amortisation that are directly and indirectly attributable to the development projects.

Completed development projects are amortised on a straight-line basis using their estimated useful lives which are determined based on a specific assessment of each development project. If the useful life cannot be estimated reliably, it is fixed at 10 years. For development projects protected by intellectual property rights, the maximum period of amortisation is the remaining duration of the relevant rights. The amortisation periods used are 5 years.

Intellectual property rights acquired are measured at cost less accumulated amortisation. Patents are amortised on a straight-line basis over their remaining duration, and licences are amortised over the term of the agreement.

Intellectual property rights etc. are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

Property, plant and equipment

Land and buildings, plant and machinery, and other fixtures and fittings, tools and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Land is not depreciated.

Cost comprises the acquisition price, costs directly attributable to the acquisition and preparation costs of the asset until the time when it is ready to be put into operation.

The basis of depreciation is cost less estimated residual value after the end of useful life. Straight-line depreciation is made on the basis of the following estimated useful lives of the assets:

Estimated useful lives and residual values are reassessed annually.

Items of property, plant and equipment are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost, usually equalling nominal value less writedowns for bad and doubtful debts.

Prepayments

Prepayments comprise incurred costs relating to subsequent financial years. Prepayments are measured at cost.

Cash

Cash comprises cash in bank deposits.

Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, which usually corresponds to nominal value.
