Independent auditor's report

To the shareholders of LOGSTOR Denmark Holding ApS

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of LOGSTOR Denmark Holding ApS for the financial year 1 January - 31 December 2019, which comprise income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Company at 31 December 2019 and of the results of the Company's operations for the financial year 1 January - 31 December 2019 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the "Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements" section of our report. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Independence

We are independent of the Company in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these rules and requirements.

Management's responsibilities for the financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of financial statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act and for such internal control as Management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, Management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements unless Management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Management's review

Business review

The Group's primary activity is to develop, manufacture and sell high-quality pre-insulated pipe systems for transportation of liquids and gases. LOGSTOR is the world's leading supplier of pre-insulated pipe systems, not only for district heating, but also for district cooling, the oil and gas sector, and various industrial verticals.

LOGSTOR is an international enterprise with sales and production companies in Denmark, Sweden, Finland and Poland as well as sales to more than 50 markets through resellers and own sales companies in Germany, the Netherlands, Switzerland, Austria, France, Lithuania, Italy, Romania and United Kingdom.

Group Financing

The current loan agreement with Nordea - which is subject to financial covenants - is in place until 2024. It provides the company with enough liquidity to execute on the internal business plan.

Financial review

The income statement for 2019 shows a profit of DKK 208,487 thousand against a profit of DKK 190,837 thousand last year, and the balance sheet at 31 December 2019 shows equity of DKK 178,218 thousand.

Events after the balance sheet date

No events have occurred after year-end, which would influence the evaluation of this annual report.

Outlook

2020 has started well with continuing focus on execution on profitable growth and increased customer focus. The results for 2020 are developing as expected. Due to the macro-economic situation prevailing in our main markets in Europe it is not possible to give an accurate forecast of the financial performance for 2020. However, as a result of performance enhancements in 2019, profitability is expected to improve in 2020 compared to 2019.

Notes to the financial statements

1 Accounting policies

The annual report of LOGSTOR Denmark Holding ApS for 2019 has been prepared in accordance with the definitions in the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to Medium-sized reporting class C entities.

In the financial year 2019, the entity has transitioned to prepare the annual report in accordance with the definitions in the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to Medium-sized Class C entities. This change has not affected the entity's profit before tax, profit for the year, balance sheet total or equity in either way current or previous fiscal year. The change has only affected the presentation and disclosure requirements in the annual report.

Apart from the above changed presentation and disclosure requirements as a result of the transition of accounting class, the annual report has been presented in accordance with the same accounting policies as last year.

In accordance with section 112(1) of the Danish Financial Statements Act, the Company has not prepared consolidated financial statements.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those of last year.

Omission of a cash flow statement

With reference to section 86(4) of the Danish Financial Statements Act, no cash flow statement is prepared for the parent company, as its cash flows are reflected in the consolidated cash flow statement.

Basis of recognition and measurement

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Company and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the Company has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Company, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

Reporting currency

The financial statements are presented in Danish kroner (DKK'000).

Foreign currency translation

On initial recognition, transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rates at the transaction date.

Receivables and payables and other monetary items denominated in foreign currencies are translated at closing rates. The difference between the exchange rates at the balance sheet date and the date at which the receivable or payable arose or was recognised in the latest financial statements is recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.



Notes to the financial statements

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Income statement

Revenue

Revenue consists of management fees to LOGSTOR Group's subsidiaries and is recognised in the income statement when delivery is made and risk has passed to the buyer. Revenue is measured at fair value of the agreed consideration exclusive of VAT.

Gross profit

Gross margin comprises revenue and external expenses.

External expenses

External expenses comprise expenses relating to the Company's ordinary activities, including expenses for premises, stationery and office supplies etc.

Staff costs

Staff costs comprise wages and salaries, including holiday allowance and pensions, and other social security costs, etc., for the Company's employees.

Profit from investments in subsidiaries

Income from investments in group enterprises comprises dividend, etc., received from the group enterprises in the financial year.

Financial income and expenses

Financial income comprises interest income, including interest income on receivables from group entities, net capital gains on financial statement items in foreign currencies as well as refunds under the on-account tax scheme, etc.

Financial expenses comprise interest expenses, including interest expenses on payables to group enterprises, net capital losses on financial statement items in foreign currencies as well as surcharges under the on-account tax scheme, etc.

Tax

Tax for the year comprises current tax for the year and changes in deferred tax. The tax expense relating to the profit/loss for the year is recognised in the income statement, and the tax expense relating to amounts directly recognised in equity is recognised directly in equity.

The Company is jointly taxed with its Danish subsidiaries. The current Danish income tax is allocated among the jointly taxed entities proportionally to their taxable income (full allocation with a refund concerning tax losses).



Notes to the financial statements

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Balance sheet

Investments in subsidiaries

Investments in group enterprises are measured at cost and are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost, usually equalling nominal value less write-downs for bad and doubtful debts.

Cash

Cash comprises cash and bank deposits.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is measured using the balance sheet liability method on all temporary differences between the carrying amount and the tax base of assets and liabilities. Where alternative tax rules can be applied to determine the tax base, deferred tax is measured based on the planned use of the asset or settlement of the liability, respectively.

Deferred tax assets, including the tax base of tax loss carry-forwards, are measured at the value at which they are expected to be utilised, either through elimination against tax on future earnings or through a set-off against deferred tax liabilities within the same legal tax entity. Any deferred net assets are measured at net realisable values.

Income tax payable or receivable

Current tax payables and receivables are recognised in the balance sheet as tax computed on the taxable income for the year, adjusted for tax on prior-year taxable income and tax paid on account.

Other payables

Other payables are measured at amortised cost, which usually corresponds to nominal value.
