Independent Auditor's Report

To the Shareholder of Welltec Oilfield Services (Continental Europe) A/S

Opinion

In our opinion, the Financial Statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Company at 31 December 2017 and of the results of the Company's operations for the financial year 1 January - 31 December 2017 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

We have audited the Financial Statements of Welltec Oilfield Services (Continental Europe) A/S for the financial year 1 January - 31 December 2017, which comprise income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes ("the Financial Statements").

Basis for opinion
