Opinion

We have audited the annual accounts of Workday Denmark ApS for the financial year 1st of February 2019 to 31 of January 2020, which comprise accounting policies used, income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes. The annual accounts are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the annual accounts give a true and fair view of the Company's assets, liabilities and financial position at 31st of January 2020 and of the results of the Company's operations for the financial year 1st of February 2019 to 31st of January 2020 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Basis for opinion

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Accounting policies

The annual report of Workday Denmark ApS for 2020 has been prepared in accordance with the provisions in the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to enterprises of reporting class B. Furthermore, the Company has chosen to comply with some of the rules which apply to class C enterprises.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those of last year.

The financial statements for 2020 are presented in DKK.

(a) Foreign currency translation

On initial recognition, transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rates at the transaction date. Foreign exchange differences arising between the exchange rate at the transaction date and the rate at the date of payment are recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.

Receivables and payables and other monetary items denominated in foreign currencies are translated at closing rates. The difference between the exchange rates at the balance sheet date and the date at which the receivable or payable arose or was recognised in the latest financial statements is recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.

Non-current assets acquired in foreign currency are measured at the exchange rate at the transaction date.

(b) Income statement

(i) Gross margin

The items revenue and external expenses have been aggregated into one item in the income statement called gross margin in accordance with section 32 of the Danish Financial Statements Act.

(ii) Revenue

Revenue is measured at fair value of the agreed consideration exclusive of VAT and taxes charged on behalf of third parties. All discounts and rebates granted are recognised in revenue.

(iii) Staff costs

Staff costs are comprised of wages and salaries, including holiday allowance and pensions, and other social security costs, etc., for the Company's employees. Refunds received from public authorities are deducted from staff costs.

(iv) Other operating expenses

Other operating expenses comprise of cost of sales, advertisement, administration, facility costs and loss on debtors.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Accounting policies (continued)

(v) Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses are comprised of interest income and expenses, charges in respect of finance leases, gains and losses on securities, payables and transactions denominated in foreign currencies, amortisation of financial assets and liabilities as well as surcharges and refunds under the on-account tax scheme, etc.

(vi) Tax for the year

The tax expense for the year, which comprises the year's current tax charge, joint taxation contributions and changes in the deferred tax charge - including changes arising from changes in tax rates - is recognised in the income statement with regard to the portion that relates to the profit/loss for the year and directly in equity with regard to the portion that relates to entries directly in equity.

(c) Balance sheet

(i) Income tax and deferred tax

Current tax payables and receivables are recognised in the balance sheet as tax computed on the taxable income for the year, adjusted for tax on prior-year taxable income and tax paid on account.

(ii) Liabilities

Financial liabilities are recognised at the date of borrowing at the net proceeds received less transaction costs paid. On subsequent recognition, financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, corresponding to the capitalised value, using the effective interest rate. Accordingly, the difference between the proceeds and the nominal value is recognised in the income statement over the term of the loan.

Financial liabilities also include the capitalised residual lease liability in respect of finance leases.

Other liabilities are measured at net realisable value.
