# Independent auditor's report

### To the shareholders of Fluido Denmark A/S

#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Fluido Denmark A/S for the financial year 1 January — 31 December 2016 comprising income statement, balance sheet and notes, including accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Company's assets, liabilities and financial position at 31 December 2016, and of the results of the Company's operations for the financial year 1 January – 31 December 2016 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

### Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. #### 1 Accounting policies

The annual report of Fluido Denmark A/S for 2016 has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to entities of reporting class B.

The accounting policies used in preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those of last year.

## Income statement

#### **Gross profit**

The Company has decided to aggregate revenue, cost of sales and other expenses of the income statement in accordance with the provisions of Section 32 of the Danish Financial Statements Act.

#### Revenue

Income from delivery of services is recognised as revenue as the service is delivered and when the risk has passed to the buyer. Revenue is calculated excluding VAT, charges and discounts.

#### Other external expenses

Other external expenses comprise expenses regarding sales and administration.

#### Staff expenses

Staff expenses comprise wages and salaries, pensions and social security costs.

## Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses are recognised in the income statement with the amounts that concern the financial year. Financial income and expenses include interest income and expenses, realised and unrealised capital gains and losses regarding securities, debt and foreign currency transactions, amortisation of financial assets and liabilities as well as surcharges.

## Tax on profit/loss for the year

Tax on profit/loss for the year comprises current tax for the year and changes in deferred tax. Current and deferred tax regarding changes in equity is recognised directly in equity.

## 1 Accounting policies (continued)

### **Balance** sheet

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits attributable to the asset will accrue to the Company, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits attributable to the asset will flow out of the Company, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

At initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Subsequently, assets and liabilities are measured as described for each item below.

#### Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost which usually corresponds to the nominal value. The value is reduced by write-downs for expected bad debts.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand as well as short-term securities with a term of less than three months which can be converted directly into cash at bank and in hand and involve only an insignificant risk of value changes.

#### Corporation tax and deferred tax

Current tax liabilities and current tax receivables are recognised in the balance sheet as calculated tax on the expected taxable income for the year, adjusted for tax on taxable income for previous years as well as for tax prepaid.

Deferred tax and the associated adjustments for the year are determined according to the balance sheet liability method as the tax base of all temporary differences between carrying amounts and the tax bases of assets and liabilities.

Deferred tax assets, including the tax base of tax losses allowed for carryforward, are recognised at the value at which they are expected to be used, either by elimination in tax on future earnings or by set-off against deferred tax liabilities in enterprises within the same legal entity and jurisdiction.

Deferred tax is measured on the basis of the tax rules and tax rates that will be effective under the legislation applicable at the balance sheet date when the deferred tax is expected to crystallise as current tax.
