## To the shareholders of ITP I Brazil Holding I K/S Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of ITP I Brazil Holding I K/S for the financial year 01.01.2018 - 31.12.2018, which comprise the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Entity's financial position at 31.12.2018 and of the results of its operations for the financial year 01.01.2018 - 31.12.2018 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

### Basis for opinion

## **Primary activities**

The purpose of the Entity is to carry out long-term sustainable investments in forestry and plantation establishment in Brazil, through equity participation in the Brazilian forest fund Florestas do Brazil Fundo de Investimento em Participacoes.

## **Activities**

Since the establishment of the Entity mid of 2015, the main activity has been investment in plantation establishment in Brazil via a Brazilian company, Florestas do Brazil Fundo de Investimento em Participacoes.

In accordance with a special agreement, this task has been performed in collaboration with the investment adviser, IWC Investment Patners A/S.

## **Economic development**

The economic development is primarily influenced by the adjustment of fair value in the underlying investments, the fair value adjustment of other investments in 2018 has been 41.853 USD.

Besides this, the economic development in the Entity has been as expected.

No events have occurred after the end of the financial year, which may have a material impact on the assessment of the financial position of the company.

## **Accounting policies**

## Reporting class

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises with addition of centain provisions for reporting class C. This financial statement are also in compliance with recognition and measurement requirements of the IFRS. The annual report has also been presented in accordance with the guidelines of ILPA, which has not made any impact on the income statement or balance sheet.

The annual report for the company is presented in its functional currency, USD.

The accounting policies applied for the financial statements are consistent with those applied last year.

### Recognition and measurement

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the Entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

## Foreign currency translation

On initial recognition, foreign currency transactions are translated applying the exchange rate at the transaction date. Receivables, payables and other monetary items denominated in foreign currencies that have not been settled at the balance sheet date are translated using the exchange rate at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences that arise between the rate at the transaction date and the one in effect at the payment date, or the rate at the balance sheet date are recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses. Property, plant and equipment, intangible assets, inventories and other non-monetary assets that have been purchased in foreign currencies are translated using historical rates.

### Fair value adjustments of other investment assets

Fair value adjustments of other investment assets comprise adjustments for the financial year of the Entity's investment assets measured at fair value at the balance sheet date.

## Other operating expenses

Other operating expenses comprise expenses of bank, audit, legal fee, and remuneration to ITP I Brazil I GP ApS.

## Other financial income

Other financial income comprises exchange rate gain on distributions from other investment, interest income, including interest income on receivables from group enterprises, net capital gains on securities, payables and transactions in foreign currencies, amortisation of financial assets as well as tax relief under the Danish Tax Prepayment Scheme etc.

## Other financial expenses

Financial income and expenses consists of realised as well as unrealised exchange rate adjustments.

## Other investments

Other investments in the portfolio company are recorded at fair value. The fair value is compiled at balance sheet date and is based on audited financial statements.

Unrealized and realized fair values of financial assets are recognized in the income statement as income portfolio companies.

### Cash

Cash comprises cash in hand and bank deposits.

### Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, which usually corresponds to nominal value.
