Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of A-House TopCo ApS for the financial year 1 January - 31 December 2018 comprising income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including accounting policies. 1 Accounting policies

The annual report of A-House TopCo ApS for 2018 has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applying to reporting class B entities under the Danish Financial Statements Act with opt-in from higher reporting classes.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those of last year.

Omission of consolidated financial statements

Pursuant to section 110(1) of the Danish Financial Statements Act, no consolidated financial statements have been prepared.

Income statement

Gross profit

Pursuant to Section 32 of the Danish Financial Statements Act, the Company has decided only to disclose gross profit. Gross profit comprises Other external expenses.

Other external expenses

Other external expenses comprise administration expenses, etc.

Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses comprise interest income and expenses.

Balance sheet

Equity investments in group entities.

Equity investments in group entities are measured at cost. Where the cost exceeds the net realisable value, write-down is made to this lower value.

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost.

Write-down is made for bad debt losses where there is an objective indication that a receivable or a portfolio of receivables has been impaired. If there is an objective indication that an individual receivable has been impaired, write-down is made on an individual basis.

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Corporation tax and deferred tax

Current tax payable and receivable is recognised in the balance sheet as tax computed on the taxable income for the year, adjusted for tax on the taxable income of prior years and for tax paid on account.

Deferred tax is measured using the balance sheet liability method on all temporary differences between the carrying amount and the tax value of assets and liabilities measured on the planned use of the asset or settlement of the liability.

Deferred tax assets, including the tax value of tax loss carryforwards, are recognised at the expected value of their utilisation within the foreseeable future, either as a set-off against tax on future income or as a set-off against deferred tax liabilities in the same legal tax entity. Deferred net assets are measured at net realisable value.

Deferred tax is measured in accordance with the tax rules and the tax rates applicable at the balance sheet date when the deferred tax is expected to crystallise as current tax. Changes in deferred tax as a result of changes in tax rates are recognised in the income statement and in equity, respectively.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash.

Liabilities

Other liabilities are measured at amortised cost, corresponding to nominal value.

2 Disclosure of material uncertainties regarding going concern

In order to ensure the Company's continued operations, A-House TopCo ApS receives annual dividends of DKK 20–30 million per year. In the annual report for 2018 for A-house Holding ApS, a proposed dividend of DKK 20 million has been included, which will re-establish the equity in A-House TopCo ApS. The future dividends ensure sufficient liquidity to the Company to settle its obligations as they fall due at least until 31 December 2018.
