Independent Auditor's Report

To the shareholders of Deloitte Nordic Holding ApS

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Deloitte Nordic Holding ApS for the financial year 1 June 2018 - 31 May 2019, which comprise an income statement, balance sheet and notes. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Company's financial position at 31 May 2019 and of the results of its operations for the financial year 1 June 2018 - 31 May 2019 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Reporting Class

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises with addition of certain provisions for reporting class C.

Income Statement

Gross profit or loss

Gross profit or loss comprises audit expenses for the year.

Financial expenses

Other financial expenses comprise interest expenses, exchange rate and fees.

Balance Sheet

Investments in associates

Investments in associates are measured at cost. Investments are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost, usually equalling nominal value less writedowns for bad and doubtful debts.

Cash

Cash comprises bank deposits.

Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, which usually corresponds to nominal value.
