### Independent auditor's report

### To the shareholders of CIV III 2017 GP ApS

### **Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of CIV III 2017 GP ApS for the financial year 01.01.2022 - 31.12.2022, which comprise the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Entity's financial position at 31.12.2022 and of the results of its operations for the financial year 01.01.2022 - 31.12.2022 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

### **Basis for opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the "Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements" section of this auditor's report. We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional ethical requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### **1 Employees**

The Company has no employees.

The Management has not received remunerations.

### **2 Contingent liabilities**

As general partner for CIV III 2017 K/S, CIV III US K/S and ECIV III 2017 K/S the Company is liable for any claims made against the limited partnership.

There are no other guarantees or contingent liabilities of the Company.

### **Accounting policies**

### **Reporting class**

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises with addition of a few provisions for reporting class C.

The accounting policies applied to these financial statements are consistent with those applied last year.

Reporting currency is Danish kroner (DKK).

#### **Consolidated financial statements**

Referring to section 110 of the Danish Financial Statements Act, no consolidated financial statements have been prepared.

#### Material errors in previous years

Due to an identification of a material error in the previous years regarding tax on profit, the comparative figures has been corrected for 2021. A reposting of the tax for the 2021 year in the amount of DKK 7.943 has been made, which resulted in decreased profit for the 2021 year and the equity has been adversely affected.

Particularly, the reposting of the tax has descreased the profit for the 2021 year and the new profit amounted to DKK 45,784. In addition, the equity has also been adversely affected, and the new equity amounted to DKK 129.985 beginning of 2022 year.

The reposting has had effect on liabilities where Income tax payable has been recognised in the amount of of DKK 7.943. The reposting has had no effect on total amount of assets.

### **Recognition and measurement**

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the Entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

### Foreign currency translation

On initial recognition, foreign currency transactions are translated applying the exchange rate at the transaction date. Receivables, payables and other monetary items denominated in foreign currencies that have not been

settled at the balance sheet date are translated using the exchange rate at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences that arise between the rate at the transaction date and the rate in effect at the payment date, or the rate at the balance sheet date, are recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.

#### **Income statement**

#### **Gross profit or loss**

Gross profit or loss comprises revenue and other external expenses.

#### Revenue

Revenue comprises fee from CIV III 2017 K/S, CIV III US K/S and ECIV III 2017 K/S for its services as general partner and related activities.

### Other external expenses

Other external expenses include expenses relating to the Entity's ordinary activities.

### Depreciation, amortisation and impairment losses

Depreciation, amortisation and impairment losses relating to impairment losses for the financial year.

### Income from other fixed asset investments

Income from other fixed asset investments comprises gains in the form of interest, dividends, etc on fixed asset investments which are not investments in group enterprises, associates or participating interests.

#### Other financial income

Other financial income comprises interest income and exchange rate adjustments.

### Other financial expenses

Other financial expenses comprise interest expenses, guarantee premium, bank charges and exchange rate adjustments.

### Tax on profit/loss for the year

Tax for the year, which consists of current tax for the year and changes in deferred tax, is recognised in the income statement by the portion attributable to the profit for the year and recognised directly in equity bythe portion attributable to entries directly in equity.

#### **Balance sheet**

### Other investments

Current tax payable or receivable is recognised in the balance sheet, stated as tax computed on this year's taxable income, adjusted for prepaid tax.

#### Cash

Cash comprises cash in bank deposits.

#### Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, which usually corresponds to nominal value.

### Tax receivable or payable

Current tax receivable or payable is recognised in the balance sheet, stated as tax computed on this year's taxable income, adjusted for prepaid tax.
