Independent auditor's report

To the shareholders of byFounders VC Invest I ApS Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of byFounders VC Invest I ApS for the financial year 20.07.2017 - 31.12.2017, which comprise the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Entity's financial position at 31.12.2017 and of the results of its operations for the financial year 20.07.2017 - 31.12.2017 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of this auditor's report. Notes

1. Going concern

As of 31 December 2017, the equity is negative and amounts to DKK 59,554, however, Management expects profit and positive cash flows for 2018, which will assure that adequate cash is earned to enable the Company to meet its obligations as they fall due. If that is not the case, the shareholders will make available the liquidity necessary for the Company to honour its short-term liabilities as they fall due.

2. Other external expenses

The company has no employees.

The Executive Board has not received any remuneration.

3. Contingent liabilities

The Company has no guarantees or contingent liabilities, but has an outstanding commitment of DKK 9m.

Accounting policies

Reporting class

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises.

This is the Company's first financial year and comprise the period 20 July 2017 – 31 December 2017, and hence no comparative figures have been presented.

Reporting currency is Danish kroner (DKK)

Recognition and measurement

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the Entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

Foreign currency translation

On initial recognition, foreign currency transactions are translated applying the exchange rate at the transaction date. Receivables, payables and other monetary items denominated in foreign currencies that have not been settled at the balance sheet date are translated using the exchange rate at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences that arise between the rate at the transaction date and the rate in effect at the payment date, or the rate at the balance sheet date, are recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.

Other external expenses

Other external expenses include expenses relating to the Entity's ordinary activities.

Other financial expenses

Other financial expenses comprise net capital or exchange losses on securities.

Other investments

Other investments are recognised and measured according to the equity method. This means that investments are measured at the pro rata share of the associates' equity value.

Upon distribution of profit or loss, net revaluation of other investments is transferred to Reserve for net revaluation according to the equity method under equity.

Other investments are written down to the lower of recoverable amount and carrying amount.

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost, usually equalling nominal value less writedowns for bad and doubtful debts.

Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, which usually corresponds to nominal value.
