Business Review

The Company's revenue for the financial period ended 31 December 2018 was DKK 13,238,469. The Company's profit for the period was DKK 296,038.

Principal Activities

The principal activity of the Company is the provision of data processing, data hosting and related activities to group companies.

Going Concern

The Company's operations generated an increase in net assets during 2018 and are expected to do so for the foreseeable future. On this basis the Directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue as an operational business for the foreseeable future. The financial statements have therefore been prepared on a going concern basis.

Principal Risks and Uncertainties

The Company is dependent on the continued success of the Amazon.com group companies. The principal risks and uncertainties they face include, among others, risks related to competition, management growth, new products, services and technologies, potential fluctuations in operating results, international expansion, outcomes of legal proceedings and claims, data centre and fulfilment centre optimisation, seasonality, commercial agreements, acquisitions and strategic transactions, foreign exchange rates, loss of key personnel, system interruption, data loss or security breaches, inventory, intellectual property rights, stock price volatility, government regulation and taxation, payments and fraud. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the period from incorporation on 7 September 2017 to 31 December 2018

1 ACTIVITIES

Amazon Data Services Denmark ApS ("the Company") is a limited liability company incorporated in Denmark and registered with the Danish Business Authority under commercial registration (CVR) number 38916394. The postal address of the Company's registered head office is at Ørestads Boulvard 73, 2300 Copenhagen, Denmark.

The Company is wholly owned by A100 ROW, Inc., ("the Parent"), a company registered and incorporated under the laws of Delaware State.

The principal activity of the Company is the provision of data processing, data hosting and related activities to group companies.

These financial statements were authorised for issue by the Board of Directors on 27 February 2019.

2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Preparation of annual financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB), and in conformity with the Danish Financial Statements Act, as laid down in the IFRS order issued in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to enterprises of reporting class B as well as selected provisions as regards larger entities. The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention. The financial statements have been presented in Danish Krone (DKK), being the functional currency of the Company.

The Company was incorporated on 7 September 2017. These are the first period financial statements of the Company from the date of incorporation to 31 December 2018 and accordingly no comparative information is available.

2.1 Tangible assets and depreciation

The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised as an asset when:

- it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the company; and
- · the cost of the item can be measured reliably

Costs include costs incurred initially to acquire or construct an item of property, plant and equipment and costs incurred subsequently to add to, or replace part of it.

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses, if any.

Depreciation is provided on all property, plant and equipment, to write down the cost, less residual value, on a straight line basis over their useful lives as follows:

2.1 Tangible assets and depreciation (continued)

The Company performs an assessment at the end of each reporting period to determine whether an asset displays any indicator of impairment. Where such indicators are noted, the amount of impairment is determined to be the difference between net book value and recoverable amount. The resulting difference is recorded in the statement of comprehensive income.

2.2 Financial instruments

Initial recognition

The Company classifies financial instruments, or their component parts, on initial recognition as a financial asset, a financial liability or an equity instrument in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement.

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised on the Company's statement of financial position when the Company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instruments.

Derecognition

Financial assets and financial liabilities are derecognised from the Company's statement of financial position when the contractual rights over the cash flows are extinguished or have been transferred, provided that in that transfer the risks and benefits inherent to ownership have been substantially conveyed.

Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the statement of financial position if, and only if, there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, or to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

Receivables

Receivables are recognised and carried at the lower of their original invoiced value and recoverable amount. Provision is made where there is objective evidence that the Company will not be able to recover balances in full. Balances are written off when the probability of recovery is assessed as being remote. Other receivables do not carry interest.

Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables are not interest bearing and are stated at their repayment value.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash held with banks and are stated at cost.

2.3 Revenue

Revenue, which is stated net of value added tax, represents amounts invoiced to other group companies and is attributable to the principal activity of the Company, recognized as services are provided.

2.4 Significant estimates

When preparing the financial statements, management undertakes a number of judgements, estimates and assumptions about the recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expense. Key areas of management judgements are related to the recognition and measurement of deferred tax assets and the useful lives of tangible assets.

2.5 Leases

Rentals and lease incentives paid under operating leases are charged to income on a straight line basis over the lease term. No assets are held under finance lease.

2.6 Share-based payment transactions

In accordance with IFRS 2 'Share-based Payment', the fair value of equity-settled share-based payments is determined at the date of grant and is expensed using an accelerated method over the vesting period, based on the Company's estimate of shares that will eventually vest. The fair value of the equity awards is based on the average of the high and low share price on the date of the grant. Details of the plan are available in Note 17.

2.7 Foreign currency translation

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies conducted in the reporting period are recognized in the financial statements at the rates of exchange on the transaction date. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rates on the statement of financial position date. Any resulting exchange rate differences are taken to the statement of comprehensive income.

2.8 Income taxes

Income taxes have been provided for using an asset and liability based approach.

Deferred income tax balances reflect the effects of temporary differences between the carrying amounts of asset and liabilities and their tax bases and are stated at enacted or substantially enacted tax rates expected to be in effect when taxes are actually paid or recovered.

Deferred tax assets are recognized only if it is probable that future taxable amounts will be available to utilize those temporary differences and losses.

In its capacity as a group company, the company is jointly taxed with other Danish group entities and is jointly and severally liable with the other jointly taxed entities for the payment of income taxes and withholding taxes on dividends, interest, and royalties falling due for payment after the joint taxation became effective.

2.9 Transactions with related parties

Transactions with related parties are accounted for in accordance with the measurement rules detailed above. All related party transactions are entered into on an arm's-length basis.

2.10 Standards, Interpretations and Amendments

2.10.1 PUBLISHED STANDARDS THAT ARE EFFECTIVE

A number of new standards and interpretations became effective in the current period. Details of these standards are provided below:

- IFRS 9 Financial Instruments effective date: 1 January 2018;
- IFRS 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers effective 1 January 2018;
- IFRS 2 Classification and Measurement of Share-Based Payment Transactions Amendment to IFRS 2 effective 1 January 2018.

The adoption of these standards and interpretations did not have a significant impact on the Company's reported results, financial position and cash flows.

2.10.2 PUBLISHED STANDARDS THAT ARE NOT YET EFFECTIVE (continued)

Certain applicable new standards, interpretations and amendments to existing standards have been published that are mandatory for the Company's accounting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2019 or later periods but which the Company has not early adopted. The Company will adopt these standards as they become effective and applicable. The application of these standards in future financial reporting periods has been assessed as listed below:

- IFRS 16 Leases effective 1 January 2019;
- IAS 12 Income Taxes Amendments resulting from Annual Improvements 2015-2017 Cycle (income tax consequences of dividends) - effective 1 January 2019;
- Amendments to IAS 19 Employee Benefits effective 1 January 2019;

With the exception of !FRS 16 Leases, it is not expected that the application of these standards will have a significant impact on the Company's reported results, financial position and cash flows. Some of the new standards, interpretations and amendments may have an impact on disclosures, when applied. These standards will be adopted as applicable in line with required effective dates.

IFRS 16 was issued in January 2016. It introduces a single, on-balance sheet lease accounting model for lessees. A lessee recognises a right-of-use asset representing its right to use the underlying asset and a lease liability representing its obligation to make lease payments. There is a recognition exemption for short-term leases, which will be recognised on a straight-line basis as expense in profit or loss.

The standard is effective for annual periods beginning on or after 1 January 2019. Early adoption is permitted. The Company plans to apply IFRS 16 initially on 1 January 2019, using a modified retrospective approach. Therefore, the cumulative effect of adopting IFRS 16 will be recognised as an adjustment to the opening balance of retained earnings at 1 January 2019, with no restatement of comparative information.

The company is in the process of finalizing the analysis of the impact of IFRS 16 at the date of issuance of these financial statements. As at 31 December 2018, the company has non-cancellable operating lease commitments of DKK 7,494,435 as disclosed in note 12. The adoption of IFRS 16 on 1 January 2019 is expected to result in the recognition of right-of-use assets with corresponding lease liabilities approximately equivalent to the discounted amount of non-cancellable operating lease commitments at 31 December 2018. We will use discount rates that represent our incremental borrowing rate at each lease commencement date. The company does not expect that the adoption of IFRS 16 will have a significant impact on its opening balance of retained earnings. The nature of expenses related to those leases will also change because IFRS 16 replaces the straight-line operating lease expense with a depreciation charge for right-of-use assets and interest expense on lease liabilities. Further, the classification of cash flows will be affected as the lease payments will be split into a principal and an interest portion which will be presented as financing and operating cash flows, respectively; operating lease payments are currently presented as operating cash flows.

14 FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

14.1 Liquidity risk

The Company's risk to liquidity is a result of the funds available to cover future commitments. The Company manages liquidity risk through an ongoing review of future commitments.

Amounts due to related parties and trade and other payables fall due in 90 days or less. The total carrying value of these financial instruments as at 31 December 2018 is DKK 11,638,282.

14.2 Interest rate risk

The Company does not hold any financial assets or liabilities that are subject to significant risk as a result of changes in interest rates. Therefore, any changes in interest rates at the reporting date would not affect the result for the period.

14,3 Credit risk

Credit risk relates mainly to cash and cash equivalents and other receivables. The Company only deposits cash with major banks with high quality credit standing and limits exposure to any one counter-party.

The maximum exposure to credit risk as at 31 December 2018 consisted of cash at bank and amounts due from related parties amounting to DKK 20,617,670. As at 31 December 2018, none of the Company's financial assets were past due or impaired.

17 SHARE-BASED PAYMENT PLANS

Amazon.com, Inc. ("Amazon") may grant equity awards to employees, officers and directors of Amazon and its subsidiaries which include Amazon Data Services Denmark ApS, as well as to consultants, agents, advisors and independent contractors, pursuant to Amazon's 1997 Stock Incentive Plan (the "1997 Plan"). Amazon may grant equity awards in the form of stock options, stock, or restricted stock units ("RSUs").

Equity awards are evidenced by, and subject to the terms and conditions of, an agreement between the recipient and Amazon, as well as the terms and conditions of the applicable plan. The following paragraphs describe the terms and conditions generally applicable to equity awards granted by Amazon under the 1997 Plan.

During 2018, RSUs were the primary type of equity award granted. RSUs are granted from the 1997 Plan. RSUs represent the right to receive shares of common stock of Amazon, on a one-for-one basis, upon vesting. There is no exercise price associated with an RSU. Employees vest in RSUs and stock options over a specified course of time that the employee provides service to Amazon or one or more of its subsidiaries. Typically, the service terms for vesting are between two and four years.

Unvested portions of equity awards are subject to forfeiture if the holder's employment or other service relationship with Amazon (including its subsidiaries) terminates.

The expense recognized for share-based awards in respect of employee services received during the period to 31 December 2018 is DKK 27,365. All employees and their associated outstanding restricted stock units transferred from the company during the year. Given this, there are no units outstanding as at 31 December 2018.
