### Independent auditor's report

### To the shareholders of Marmorbyen Vest 2 Komplementar ApS

### **Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of Marmorbyen Vest 2 Komplementar ApS for the financial year 1 January – 31 December 2018 comprising income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Company's assets, liabilities and financial position at 31 December 2018 and of the results of the Company's operations for the financial year 1 January – 31 December 2018 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

### **Basis for opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the "Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements" section of our report. ### **Notes**

#### 1 Accounting policies

The annual report of Marmorbyen Vest 2 Komplementar ApS for 2018 has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applying to reporting class B entities under the Danish Financial Statements Act with opt-in from higher reporting classes.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those of last year.

### Income statement

#### **Gross Profit**

Pursuant to section 32 of the Danish Financial Statements Act, the Company does not disclose its revenue.

The gross profit reflects an aggregation of revenue and other external expenses.

#### Revenue

Revenue comprising income from partnership is recognised in the period to which it relates.

### Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses comprise expenses incurred during the year for management and administration of the Limited partnership.

### **Balance sheet**

### Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost.

#### Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand comprise cash at bank.

### Corporation tax and deferred tax

Current tax payable and receivable is recognised in the balance sheet as tax computed on the taxable income for the year, adjusted for tax on the taxable income of prior years and for tax paid on account.

Deferred tax is measured using the balance sheet liability method on all temporary differences between the carrying amount and the tax value of assets and liabilities based on the planned use of the asset or settlement of the liability. However, deferred tax is not recognised on temporary differences relating to goodwill non-deductible for tax purposes and on office premises and other items where the temporary differences arise at the date of acquisition without affecting either profit/loss or taxable income.

Deferred tax assets, including the tax value of tax loss carryforwards, are recognised at the expected value of their utilisation within the foreseeable future; either as a set-off against tax on future income or as

a set-off against deferred tax liabilities in the same legal tax entity. Any deferred net assets are measured at net realisable value.

Deferred tax is measured in accordance with the tax rules and at the tax rates applicable at the balance sheet date when the deferred tax is expected to crystallise as current tax. Changes in deferred tax as a result of changes in tax rates are recognised in the income statement or equity, respectively.

#### Liabilities

Other liabilities are measured at net realisable value.

The company has lost more than half of its share capital.

### 3 Contingent liabilities

The company is subject to the Danish scheme of joint taxation and unlimited jointly and severally liable with the other taxed companies for the total corporation tax, therefore the Company is jointly taxed with the parent company Ejendomsselskabet PADK M3.

The Company is general partner for Marmorbyen Vest 2 P/S. As general partner, the Company is liable for Marmorbyen Vest 2 P/S's liabilities.
