Independent Auditor's Report

To the Shareholder of Haldor Topsøe Project Investment A/S

Opinion

In our opinion, the Financial Statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Company at 31 December 2019, and of the results of the Company's operations for the financial year 2019 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

We have audited the Financial Statements of Haldor Topsøe Project Investment A/S for the financial year 2019, which comprise income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies ("financial statements").

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Statement on Management's Review

Management is responsible for Management's Review.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover Management's Review, and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read Management's Review and, in doing so, consider whether Management's Review is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

Moreover, it is our responsibility to consider whether Management's Review provides the information required under the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Based on the work we have performed, in our view, Management's Review is in accordance with the Financial Statements and has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Danish Financial Statements Act. We did not identify any material misstatement in Management's Review.

Management's Responsibilities for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of Financial Statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act, and for such internal control as Management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, Management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements unless Management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.

Directors' Report

Main activities

The purpose of the Company is to pursue and conduct project investments and related commercial activities. The activities include holding shares in subsidiaries, whenever deemed relevant by the Board of the Company.

Haldor Topsøe Project Investment A/S owns 100% of HT Ramagundam A/S and Haldor Topsoe Project Development Inc.

Haldor Topsøe Project Investment A/S is a whollyowned subsidiary of Haldor Topsøe A/S.

Results

The net result for 2019 was a loss of DKK 19.1 million. The net result mainly comprises the annual results from subsidiaries, negatively impacted by a DKK 26 million goodwill impairment loss in Haldor Topsoe Project Development Inc. regarding restructuring.

The loss for the year has resulted in the loss of the company's equity. Management expects to restore the Company's registered capital through own future earnings. The parent company has granted a Letter of financial support effective until 31 May 2021.

Accounting Policies

Basis of preparation

The Annual Report of Haldor Topsøe Project Investment A/S for 2019 has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to enterprises of reporting class B as well as selected rules applying to reporting class C.

Recognition and measurement

Income is recognized in the income statement as earned. All expenses are recognized in the income statement.

Assets are recognized in the balance sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits attributable to the asset will flow to the Company, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognized in the balance sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Company, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

Assets and liabilities are initially measured at cost. Subsequently, assets and liabilities are measured as described for each item below.

Recognition and measurement take into account predictable losses and risks occurring before the presentation of the Annual Report which confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date.

Translation of foreign currency

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated during the year at the exchange rates at the dates of transaction. Gains and losses arising due to differences between the rates at the transaction date and the rates at the dates of payment are recognized in financial income and expenses in the income statement.

Receivables and payables in foreign currencies that have not been settled at the balance sheet

date are translated at the exchange rates at the balance sheet date. Any differences between the exchange rates at the balance sheet date and the transaction date rates are recognized in financial income and expenses in the income statement.

Income Statement

Other external expenses

Other external expenses comprise expenses for external assistance etc.

Financial expenses

Financial expenses comprise of interest, dividends, fair value adjustment and realized and unrealized foreign currency translation adjustments.

Tax

The Company is jointly taxed with Danish entities within the Haldor Topsøe Holding A/S Group in the mandatory Danish joint taxation. Tax for the year comprises current tax for the year and deferred tax for the year.

The tax attributable to the profit for the year is recognized in the income statement, whereas the tax attributable to equity entries is recognized directly in equity. Any share of the tax reported in the income statement arising from profit/loss on extraordinary activities for the year is attributed to such activities, whereas the remaining share is attributed to profit/loss on ordinary activities for the year.

Balance Sheet

Investments in group enterprises

Investments in group enterprises are recognized and measured under the equity method. Acquisitions are measured using the consolidation method.

Group enterprises which have negative equity are measured at DKK 0, and receivables from these group enterprises are written down by the parent company's share of the negative equity if it is estimated to be irrecoverable.

If the negative equity exceeds receivables, the remaining amount is recognized under provisions to the extent the parent company has a legal or constructive obligation to cover the group enterprise's deficit.

The item "Result of investments in group enterprises" in the income statement includes the proportionate share of the result after tax.

Receivables

Receivables are recognized in the balance sheet at the lower of the amortized cost and the net realizable value, which corresponds to the nominal value less provisions for bad debts.

Corporate income tax and deferred tax

Current tax receivables and current tax liabilities are recognized in receivables in the balance sheet in the event of overpayment of tax on account, and in liabilities in the event of underpayment of tax on account.

Deferred tax is measured under the balance sheet liability method in respect of all temporary differences between the carrying amount and the tax base of assets and liabilities. Deferred tax assets, including the tax base of tax loss carry-forwards, are measured at the value at which the asset is expected to be realized, either by elimination in tax on

future earnings or by set-off against deferred tax liabilities within the same legal tax entity and jurisdiction.

Financial liabilities

Other debts are measured at amortized cost, mainly corresponding to nominal value.

3 Subsequent events

No events materially affecting the Company's financial position at December 31, 2019 have occured after the balance sheet date.

The implications of COVID-19 with many governments across the world deciding to 'close down their countries' will have great impact on the global economy. Management considers the implications of COVID-19 a subsequent event occurred after the balance sheet date 31 December 2019, and therefore will not have any effect on the Financial Statements for 2019 (a non-adjusting event).

4 Consolidated financial statements

Haldor Topsøe A/S prepares consolidated financial statements, which include the Company and its group enterprises.

5 Contingent liabilities

Through participation in joint taxation scheme with Haldor Topsøe Holding A/S, the company is jointly and severally liable for taxes payable, etc. in Denmark.
