Managements review

The principal activities of the company

The main activity is to provide strategic advice, as well as to design and build capabilities to help organizations with their digital strategy, as well as build and maintain digital services (web site apps, platforms, etc.).

Development in activities and financial matters

The financial statement shows a profit which the management considers satisfactory. For the coming year a positive net income is expected.

Events occurring after the end of the financial year

The uncertainties created by COVID-19 and uncertain about the state of the world unfortunately continues. It is not possible to make a reasonable assessment of the economic failures of COVID-19. For the same reason, it is not possible to express one to the same safeguards for waiting for repatriation and settlement before tax. It seems, however, that COVID-19 does not have a significant effect on the friendship of the sentence and the result before it came but the years when it is not affected by the closure to the same degree, which some see differently as it does.

Financial Statement

Accounting policies

The annual report is presented in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act regulations concerning reporting class B enterprises. Furthermore, the company has decided to comply with certain rules applying to reporting class C enterprises.

Recognition and measurement

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event of which future economic benefits will arise and the value can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the entity has a legal obligation as a result of a prior event.

On initial recognition assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each item in the financial statement. Anticipated risks and losses arising prior to the presentation of the Annual Report which confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the date of the balance sheet are considered on recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when realised, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

Foreign currency translation

On initial recognition, transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rate at the transaction date. Foreign exchange differences arising between the exchange rates at the transaction date and the date of payment are recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.

Receivables and payables and other monetary items denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rate at the balance sheet date. The difference between the exchange rates at the balance sheet date and the date at which the receivable or payable arose or was recognised in the most recent financial statements is recognised in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.

Income statement

Gross profit

Gross profit comprises the revenue, changes in inventories of finished goods, and work in progress, work performed for own account and capitalised, other operating income, and external costs.

Revenue is recognised in the income statement if delivery and passing of risk to the buyer have taken place before the end of the year and if the income can be determined reliably and inflow is anticipated. Recognition of revenue is exclusive of VAT and taxes and less any discounts relating directly to sales.

Other external costs comprise costs incurred for distribution, sales, advertising, administration, premises, loss on receivables, and operational leasing costs.

Staff expenses

Staff costs include salaries and wages, including holiday allowances, pensions, and other social security costs, etc., for staff members. Staff costs are less government reimbursements.

Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses comprise interest, realised and unrealised capital gains and losses concerning financial assets and liabilities, amortisation of financial assets and liabilities, additions and reimbursements under the Danish tax prepayment scheme, etc. Financial income and expenses are recognised in the income statement with the amounts concerning the financial year.

Corporate tax on taxable income

Tax for the year comprises the current income tax for the year and changes in deferred tax and is recognised in the income statement with the share attributable to the net profit or loss for the year and directly in equity with the share attributable to entries directly in equity.

Balance sheet

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost which usually corresponds to face value. In order to meet expected losses, they are written down for impairment to the net realisable value.

Cash at hand and in bank

Cash at hand and in bank comprise cash at bank and at hand.

Equity - proposed dividend

Proposed dividend is reserved under the equity at the time of the approval of the General Meeting.

Corporate tax on taxable income and deferred tax

Current tax receivables and tax liabilities are recognised in the statement of financial position with the amount calculated on the basis of the expected taxable income for the year adjusted for tax on previous years' taxable income and prepaid taxes. Tax receivables and tax liabilities are offset to the extent that a legal right of set-off exists and the items are expected to be settled net or simultaneously.

Deferred tax is tax on all temporary differences in the carrying amount and tax base of assets and liabilities measured on the basis of the planned application of the asset and disposal of the liability, respectively.

Deferred tax assets, including the tax value of tax losses eligible for carryforward, are recognised at their expected realisable value, either by settlement against tax of future earnings or by setoff in deferred tax liabilities within the same legal tax unit. Any deferred net tax assets are measured at net realisation value.

Deferred tax is measured on the basis of the tax rules and tax rates of applicable legislation at the reporting date and prevailing when the deferred tax is expected to be released as current tax.

Liabilities other than provisions

Other liabilities other than provisions are measured at amortised cost which usually corresponds to the nominal value.
