Independent Auditor's Report

To the shareholders of BHG Copenhagen I ApS

Opinion

In our opinion, the Financial Statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Company at 31 December 2019 and of the results of the Company's operations and cash flows for the financial year 4 February - 31 December 2019 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

We have audited the Financial Statements of BHG Copenhagen I ApS for the financial year 4 February - 31 December 2019, which comprise income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity, cash flow statement and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies ("the Financial Statements").

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Management's Review

The Company's principal activities

The Company's principal activities consist in running hotel business as of opening as well as all business as decided herewith. During 2019 the hotel was still under construction.

Development in activities and financial matters

The Company's Income Statement of the financial year 4 February 2019 - 31 December 2019 shows a result of DKK -585.675 and the Balance Sheet at 31 December 2019 a balance sheet total of DKK 954.301 and an equity of DKK -535.675.

Capital resources

The Company's equity amounts to DKK -535.675 at 31 December 2019 and is therefore subject to section 119 of the Danish Companies Act on capital losses. The Company expects to re-establish the capital over the coming financial years through its own operations.

The parent Company has issued a Letter of Comfort covering 12 months from the balance sheet date. Based on this, Management has assessed the capital resources sufficiently.

Subsequent events

The COVID-19 pandemic will have significant impact on the global economy, with many governments across the world deciding to "close down their countries". Management considers the implications of COVID-19 a subsequent event, which occurred after the balance sheet date (31 December 2019). It is therefore considered a non-adjusting event for the Company.

It is the company's expectation that the effects of COVID-19, will have a minor effect on the capital resources of the company and future cash-flow in short term.

In addition, no events have occurred after the reporting date of importance to the Annual Report.

Accounting Policies

Reporting Class

The Annual Report of BHG Copenhagen I ApS for 2019 has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to enterprises of reporting class B, with the adoption of individual rules from class C.

As the financial year 2019 is the Company's first financial year, the Financial Statements with associated notes have been prepared without comparative figures from the previous year. The first financial year does not contain a 12 month period but covers 4 February - 31 December.

Reporting currency

The Annual Report is presented in Danish kroner.

General Information

Basis of recognition and measurement

Income is recognised in the Income Statement as it is earned. Moreover, all expenses incurred to achieve the earnings for the year are recognised in the Income Statement, including depreciation, amortisation, impairment losses and provisions as well as reversals due to changed accounting estimates of amounts that have previously been recognised in the Income Statement.

Assets are recognised in the Balance Sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits attributable to the asset will accrue to the Company, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the Balance Sheet when it is probable that future economic benefits attributable to the asset will flow out of the Company, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

At initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Subsequently, assets and liabilities are measured as described for each item below.

Income Statement

Gross profit/loss

The Company has decided to aggregate certain items of the Income Statement in accordance with the provisions of Section 32 of the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Gross profit covers other operating expenses.

Other external expenses

Other external costs include costs for administration.

Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses are recognised in the Income Statement based on the amounts that concern the financial year.

Tax on net profit for the year

Tax on net profit/loss for the year comprises current tax on expected taxable income of the year and the year's adjustment of deferred tax less the part of the tax of the year that relates to changes in equity. Current and deferred tax regarding changes in equity is recognised directly in equity.

Accounting Policies

Balance Sheet

Tangible assets

Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and less any accumulated impairment losses.

Cost comprises the cost of acquisition and expenses directly related to the acquisition up until the time when the asset is ready for use.

Depreciation based on cost reduced by any residual value is calculated on a straight-line basis over the expected useful lives of the assets, which are:

Leasehold improvements 25 years

Depreciation period and residual value are reassessed annually.

Other receivables

Other receivables are measured at amortised cost which usually corresponds to the nominal value. The value is reduced by write-downs for expected bad debts.

Liabilities

Debts are measured at amortised cost, substantially corresponding to nominal value.
