MANAGEMENT'S REVIEW

Main activities

The main activity of the company is sales of packaging.

Development in the activities and the financial situation of the company

There has not occurred any significant one-off events in the financial year that need to be included in the management review.

The performance and results for the year are not satisfactory but as expected. The covid 19 pandemic has made the market unstable and difficult to navigate in, but the company setup is good and ready when the pandemic restrictions are lowered.

Financially the parent company will also in 2022 provide the necessary liquidity to achieve the goals for 2022.

Material events after the reporting date

No events have occurred after the reporting date that may materially affect the financial position of the company.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The financial statements of Supravis Nordic ApS for the financial year 2021 have been prepared in conformity with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act on class B enterprises combined with a few rules on class C enterprises.

The accounting policies applied in the financial statements are consistent with those of the previous year. The reporting currency is Danish kroner.

Recognition and measurement in general

Assets are recognized in the balance sheet when it is probable that future financial benefits will flow to the Company and it is possible to obtain a reliable measurement of the individual assets.

Liabilities are recognized in the balance sheet when it is probable that future financial benefits will flow from the Company and it is possible to obtain a reliable measurement of the individual liabilities.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Subsequently, assets and liabilities are measured as described for each item.

Anticipated losses and risks arising before the presentation of the financial statements and confirming or disconfirming facts and circumstances known at the reporting date are taken into consideration at recognition and measurement.

Foreign currency translation

Foreign currency transactions are translated at the exchange rates ruling at the transaction dates. Gains and losses arising from movements between the exchange rates at the date of the individual transaction and the date of payment are recognized in the income statement as financial income or financial expenses.

INCOME STATEMENT

General information

Certain income and expenses have been aggregated in the item designated 'Gross profit' with reference to section 32 of the Financial Statements Act.

Gross profit

Gross profit is a combination of the items of Revenue, 'Cost of raw materials and consumables and Other external costs.

Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods for resale and finished goods is recognized in the income statement if the goods have been delivered and the risk has passed to the buyer before year-end. Revenue is recognized exclusive of VAT and net of sales discounts.

Cost of raw materials and consumables

Cost of raw materials and consumables includes the cost of goods purchased less discounts and changes in inventories for the year.

Other external expenses

Other external expenses include costs for administration.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Staff costs

Staff costs include wages, salaries and other pay-related costs, such as sickness benefits for enterprise employees less wage/salary reimbursement from the Government.

Financial income and expenses

Financial income and expenses are recognized in the income statement based on the amounts which relate to the financial year. Financial income and expenses include interest revenue and expenses and realized and unrealized gains and losses on transactions in foreign currencies.

Tax on net profit for the year

Tax for the year comprises current tax and changes in deferred tax. The share attributable to the profit or loss for the year is recognized in the income statement, and the share attributable directly to equity is recognized directly in equity.

BALANCE SHEET

Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost according to the FIFO method. Where the net realizable value is lower than cost, the inventories are written down to this lower value.

The net realizable value of inventories is calculated as the selling price less costs of completion and costs incurred to perform sales. The value is determined taking into consideration marketability, obsolescence and development in expected selling price.

Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortized cost, which normally corresponds to the nominal value. The value is reduced by an allowance for expected impairment losses.

Corporate income tax and deferred tax

Current tax liabilities and current tax receivable are recognized in the balance sheet as calculated tax on the taxable income for the year, adjusted for tax on the taxable income for previous years and tax paid on account.

Deferred tax is measured using the balance-sheet liability method on temporary differences arising between the carrying amount of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases. In cases where the tax base can be determined under alternative taxation rules, such as in relation to shares, deferred tax is measured on the basis of the intended use of the asset or settlement of the liability.

Deferred tax assets, including the tax base of tax losses allowed for carryforward, are measured at their anticipated net realizable value, either by elimination in tax on future earnings or by offsetting against deferred tax liabilities within the same legal tax entity. Any deferred net tax assets are measured at their net realizable values.

Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rules and tax rates applying under the legislation on the balance sheet and prevailing when the deferred tax is expected to be released as current tax.

Payables

Other payables, comprising trade payables and amounts owed to Group enterprises and associates and other accounts payable, are measured at amortized cost, which normally corresponds to the nominal value.
