## Independent auditor's report

#### To the shareholder of Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I GP ApS

#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I GP ApS for the financial year 01.01.2022 - 31.12.2022, which comprise the income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Entity's financial position at 31.12.2022 and of the results of its operations for the financial year 01.01.2022 - 31.12.2022 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

#### **Basis for opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the "Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements" section of this auditor's report. We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional ethical requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### Management's responsibilities for the financial statements

As general partner for Copenhagen Infrastructure Energy Transition Fund I K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I DK A K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I DK B K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I US QFPF K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I US Non-QFPF K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I US Feeder K/S and CI ETF I US HoldCo K/S the Company is liable for any claims against the limited partnerships.

The Entity participates in a Danish joint taxation arrangement where SP GP Interests Holding ApS serves as the administration company. According to the joint taxation provisions of the Danish Corporation Tax Act, the Entity is therefore liable for income taxes etc. for the jointly taxed entities, and for obligations, if any, relating to the withholding of tax on interest, royalties and dividend for the jointly taxed entities. The jointly taxed entities' total known net liability under the joint taxation arrangement is disclosed in the administration company's financial statements.

There are no other guarantees or contingent liabilities of the Entity.

## **Accounting policies**

#### **Reporting class**

This annual report has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act governing reporting class B enterprises with addition of a few provisions for reporting class C.

The accounting policies applied to these financial statements are consistent with those applied last year.

Reporting currency is Danish kroner (DKK).

#### **Recognition and measurement**

Assets are recognised in the balance sheet when it is probable as a result of a prior event that future economic benefits will flow to the Entity, and the value of the asset can be measured reliably.

Liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the Entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a prior event, and it is probable that future economic benefits will flow out of the Entity, and the value of the liability can be measured reliably.

On initial recognition, assets and liabilities are measured at cost. Measurement subsequent to initial recognition is effected as described below for each financial statement item.

Anticipated risks and losses that arise before the time of presentation of the annual report and that confirm or invalidate affairs and conditions existing at the balance sheet date are considered at recognition and measurement.

Income is recognised in the income statement when earned, whereas costs are recognised by the amounts attributable to this financial year.

#### **Income statement**

#### **Gross profit or loss**

Gross profit or loss comprises revenue and other external expenses.

#### Revenue

Revenue comprises fees received from Copenhagen Infrastructure Energy Transition Fund I K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I DK A K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I DK B K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I US QFPF K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I US Non-QFPF K/S, Copenhagen Infrastructure ETF I US Feeder K/S and CI ETF I US HoldCo K/S for acting as general partner and related activities.

#### Other external expenses

Other external expenses include expenses relating to the Entity's ordinary activities.

#### Other financial expenses

Other financial expenses comprise interest expenses.

#### **Balance sheet**

#### Receivables

Receivables are measured at amortised cost, usually equalling nominal value less writedowns for bad and doubtful debts.

#### Cash

Cash comprises cash in bank deposits.

#### **Other financial liabilities**

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, which usually corresponds to nominal value.
