MANAGEMENT REVIEW

Iv3 Aqua Holding A/S has been founded by APMH Invest A/S on 22 March 2021.

The first accounting period is 22 March to 31 December 2021.

The objective of the company is to invest, directly or indirectly through other companies, in cash flow generating assets within the fields of water production, distribution and treatment, and wastewater treatment and collection, and such other activities which in the discretion of the board of directors are related thereto.

PROFIT/LOSS FOR THE YEAR

Loss for the year after tax amounted to USD 1.4m.

The result for the year is proposed distributed to retained earnings. No dividend is proposed for 2021.

As of 31 December 2021, the equity amounted to USD 1.3m.

OUTLOOK FOR 2022

The company's profit will essentially come from the share of the profit of its future activities within the water field.

Note 1: Staff costs

Apart from the Executive Board, Iv3 Aqua Holding A/S has not had any employees in 2021.

The Board of Directors have received USD 66,667 in board fee from the company in 2021. The Executive Board has not received any remuneration from the company. The Executive Board and Board of Directors are either remunerated directly from the company or from A.P. Møller Holding A/S.

Note 2: Related parties

The company has not entered into any transactions with related parties that were not on an arm's length basis.

Note 3: Contingent liabilities

The company is included in national joint taxation with Danish companies in the A.P. Møller Holding group. The company is jointly and severally liable for the payment of taxes and withholding tax.

Note 4: Significant accounting policies

The Financial Statements for 2021 for Iv3 Aqua Holding A/S have been prepared on a going concern basis and in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to enterprises of reporting class B, with a selection of certain requirements from reporting class C.

With reference to section 110 of the Danish Financial Statements Act, the company has not prepared consolidated financial statements.

It is the company's first financial year.

The financial statements are presented in USD.

FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSLATION

Transactions in currencies other than the functional currency are translated at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction. Monetary items in foreign currencies not settled at the balance sheet date are translated at the exchange rate as per the balance sheet date. Foreign exchange gains and losses are included in the income statement as financial income or expenses.

INCOME STATEMENT

Other external expenses

Other external expenses comprise expenses for administration, office supplies, etc.

Staff costs

Staff costs comprise board fees.

Other financial items

Other financial income and expenses comprise interest expenses and income, bank fees, net exchange gains and losses on transactions in foreign currencies etc.

Tax

Tax comprises an estimate of current and deferred income tax.

Tax is recognised in the income statement to the extent it arises from items recognised in the income statement.

BALANCE SHEET

Investment in subsidiaries

Investment in subsidiaries are measured at cost. The investments are written down to any lower net realisable value if it is lower than the carrying amount.

Dividends received from subsidiaries are recognised as Income from subsidiaries.

Receivables

Receivables are generally recognised at nominal value, substantially corresponding to amortised cost and impaired for expected losses. Impairment of receivables are based on the expected loss model as described in IFRS 9.

Prepayment

Prepayment comprise prepaid Advisory fee to the company's subsidiary.

Cash

Cash comprises cash in bank deposits.

Liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, substantially corresponding to nominal value.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

OPINION

In our opinion, the Financial Statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the company at 31 December 2021, and of the results of the company's operations for the financial year 22 March-31 December 2021 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

We have audited the Financial Statements of APMH Invest XIX A/S for the financial year 22 March-31 December 2021, which comprise income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies ("financial statements").

BASIS FOR OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our

report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

STATEMENT ON MANAGEMENT REVIEW

Management is responsible for Management Review.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover Management Review, and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read Management Review and, in doing so, consider whether Management Review is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

Moreover, it is our responsibility to consider whether Management Review provides the information required under the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Based on the work we have performed, in our view, Management Review is in accordance with the Financial Statements and has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Danish Financial Statements Act. We did not identify any material misstatement in Management Review.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Management is responsible for the preparation of Financial Statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements unless management either intends to liquidate the company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

AUDITOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
