The result for the year is proposed distributed to retained earnings. No dividend is proposed for 2023.

As of 31 December 2023, the equity amounted to DKK 86,501.

OUTLOOK FOR 2024

The company's profit will essentially come from the share of the profit of its future activities, which have not yet been decided.

Note 1: Other external expenses

Apart from the Executive Board, APMH Invest XXXII ApS has not had any employees in 2023. The Executive board has not received any remuneration from the company and is remunerated by A.P. Møller Holding A/S.

Note 2: Share capital

The share capital is nominal DKK 40,000, divided into shares of nominal DKK 1 each.

Note 3: Related parties

APMH Invest A/S holds 100% of the company's share capital and the controlling interest on the company.

The company has not entered into any transactions with related parties that were not on an arm's length basis.

CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

APMH Invest XXXII ApS is included in the consolidated financial statements for A.P. Møller Holding A/S, Copenhagen, Denmark, Business Registration No 25 67 92 88. The consolidated financial statement of A.P. Møller Holding A/S can be required at www.cvr.dk.

Note 4: Contingent assets

A minor tax loss carry forward exists as of 31 December 2023. The tax asset is not recognised in the balance sheet, as it is unknown when the company will be able to use the tax asset for tax purposes. Tax losses carried forward have no time limitation.

Note 5: Contingent liabilities

The company is included in national joint taxation with Danish companies in the A.P. Moller Holding group. The company is jointly and severally liable for the payment of taxes and withholding tax.

Note 6: Events after the balance sheet date

No events of importance to the Annual Report have occurred during the period from the balance sheet date until the presentation of the financial statements.

Note 7: Significant accounting policies

The Financial Statements for 2023 for APMH Invest XXXII ApS have been prepared on a going concern basis and in accordance with the provisions of the Danish Financial Statements Act applying to enterprises of reporting class B, with a selection of certain requirements from reporting class C.

It is the company's first financial year.

The financial statements are presented in DKK.

Other external expenses

Other external expenses comprise expenses for administration, office supplies, etc.

Other financial income and expenses

Other financial items comprise interest income and expenses, bank fees, etc.

Tax

Tax comprises an estimate of current and deferred income tax.

Tax is recognised in the income statement to the extent it arises from items recognised in the income statement.

Cash

Cash comprises cash in bank deposits.

Liabilities

Other financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost, substantially corresponding to nominal value.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the shareholder of APMH Invest XXXII ApS

OPINION

In our opinion, the Financial Statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the company at 31 December 2023, and of the results of the company's operations for the financial year 26 June – 31 December 2023 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

We have audited the Financial Statements of APMH Invest XXXII ApS for the financial year 26 June – 31 December 2023, which comprise income statement, balance sheet, statement of changes in equity and notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies ("financial statements").

BASIS FOR OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the "Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements" section of our report. We are independent of the company in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for

Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

STATEMENT ON MANAGEMENT REVIEW

Management is responsible for Management Review.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover Management Review, and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read Management Review and, in doing so, consider whether Management Review is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

Moreover, it is our responsibility to consider whether Management Review provides the information required under the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Based on the work we have performed, in our view, Management Review is in accordance with the Financial Statements and has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Danish Financial Statements Act. We did not identify any material misstatement in Management Review.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Management is responsible for the preparation of Financial Statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements unless management either intends to liquidate the company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the company's internal control.
